The White Mountain Coalition Against Homelessness (WMCAH), now DBA White Mountain Victory Village, was established in 2015 by several churches, agencies and concerned citizens to serve the homeless population of Northeastern Arizona with a **Hand-up** rather than a **Hand-out**.

Transitional Housing

The Coalition's Transitional Housing offers a 90-day, live-in program to help those suffering from homelessness by providing help with shelter, food and the tools to become self-sufficient. We are NOT an emergency center; rather, we operate a program designed to assist people recovering from the stigma and difficulties of being homeless.

Our Process

We offer a safe and secure living environment where residents are required to live drug and alcohol free while in the program. Residents are required to participate in job-seeking skills, life skills training and budget management skills through our network.

80% of our clients complete our program because we ask them to invest in themselves!

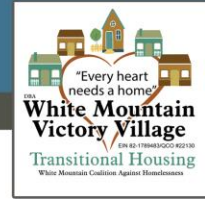
