The White Mountain Coalition Against Homelessness (WMCAH), now **dba White Mountain Victory Village**, was established in 2015 by several churches, agencies and concerned citizens to serve the homeless population of Northeastern Arizona with a **Hand-up** rather than a **Hand-out**.

What is Transitional Housing?

Transitional Housing is a community project that offers longer support to individuals and families experiencing homelessness by providing a stable and supportive living environment while having residents work towards finding permanent housing.

How does our program work?

This is a CLEAN and SOBER working program for people who WANT to help themselves. We provide a safe living environment and supportive services to people who are wanting to put their lives back together from whatever traumatic event that made them homeless to begin with. We will assist individuals in developing the skills and help find resources necessary to move into permanent housing, such as life skills training, employment assistance and access to community resources.

80% of our clients complete our program because we ask them to invest in themselves!


