Shining a Light on the Past

WAHS was delighted to hear from Therese Bergholz, owner of Branches Winery, when she asked if we would participate in the winery's quilting event on July 13. Having an "autograph quilt" in our collection, we were excited to



show it off to hobbyists and professional quilters. There are 16 names embroidered in each circle with a name or date in the middle for a total of 712 names on the quilt. Sewn in 1912, this quilt was used as a fundraiser after the Coon Prairie Church burned on Easter Sunday in 1909. The women of the Ladies' Aid used the money to replace the altar clothes, candles, and other items that beautified the church and were lost in the fire. Mrs. Amanda (Martin) Bekkedal either had the highest auction bid or won the quilt top in a raffle. It was donated to WAHS by her great-granddaughter, Kris Polsfut, in 2007.
