"I don't know why, but I have to come," is what Dennis Gage said to Chairperson Garland McGarvey when he was asked to attend *Sweet Rides & Sweet Pies*. Dennis could not imagine how the mix of a "homemade pies with ice cream" social, sharing history, and a car show would be successful, but after the event, he sent a message to Garland: "This was much more than a car show and you delivered on all aspects for all constituencies..... The pie was pretty awesome, too!"

We are very proud of this extremely high praise coming from someone of Dennis' stature — a genuine celebrity in the car world, host of 29 seasons of his national hit TV show, *My Classic Car*, and all-around great guy. Dennis had never heard of an event like *Sweet Rides*, but here we are! 2025 celebrated our 10th year! We sold out of more than 650 pieces of pie, many people learned about the history of automobiles in Westby and got a tour of our Thoreson House Museum & Genealogy Center, and more than 300 cars were at the event — that's a great mix of pie, history, and cars! For a one-day, 6-hour event, we brought more than 2,000 people to town, brought shoppers to Westby businesses, and had a very successful fundraiser for WAHS. Shining a Light on the Past

Because we celebrated the completion of the Main Street Construction Project last month with the Opening Ceremony for *Sweet Rides*, this article from the August 26, 1925 "*Westby Times*," 100 years ago, is appropriate for today's column!

INTERSTATE HIGHWAY THROUGH WESTBY

2,000 Miles of Wisconsin Highways to Become Part of Big National System

Madison, Wis. — Wisconsin will have nine interstate federal roads marked by the United States government with a standard design. The routes were outlined in a report by W. O. Hotchkiss of the Wisconsin highway commission, made public by F. A. Cannon, executive secretary of the Good Roads association of Wisconsin.

3 — Route 11 from Superior through Eau Claire, La Crosse, Westby, Viroqua, thence on Route 27 to Prairie du Chien, then on Routes 19 and 11 through Lancaster to Dubuque and down the west side of the Mississippi river through St. Louis to Natchez, crossing there and going to New Orleans.

The Norwegian blue, the nisse figures, and "Velkommen" are all a nod to our Norwegian heritage. 








2025 marks the 200-year anniversary of the first purposeful immigration of Norwegians to the US. On July 4, 1825, 7 crew members and 45 passengers (including 19 children) left Stavanger on a sloop named the *Restoration*. On October 9, they arrived in New York with a new baby, making 53. That migration was the first of more than 900,000 people who left Norway, many of whom settled in the Westby area, with an idea of a better life.
