PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members and Friends of WAHS,

Thirty-five years ago, the Westby Area Historical Society organized to preserve the heritage of our city and the surrounding area. We document the area's history and those who have lived here through artifacts, our genealogical collections, and many other materials in the archives. Each year, the Westby Area Historical Society continues to receive valuable items, manuscripts, and photographs donated by those who see value in the work we do to preserve the past for future generations. We thank those who have sought us

out and have trusted us to keep their treasures safe so that we can share them with those interested in our local history.

This month marked the 101st anniversary of the first Snowflake Ski Tournament in Westby held back in 1923. We were pleased that the Snowflake Ski Club reached out to us to exhibit historic ski jumping films from the WAHS Lincoln Knutson Collection. The films and a unique historic posterboard designed by WAHS highlighted the club's activities over the last century. Snowflake's leadership also asked WAHS to help with a special seven-question survey. The survey results, designed to discover the impact of the Snowflake Ski Tournament on the local and regional economy, will assist the club with grant applications and future fundraising.

We are holding our general membership meetings in the early afternoons, now at 1:00 p.m., the first Tuesday of every month. Our upcoming March meeting will be held at the Daily Brew Coffee Shop in Westby. In April, the monthly meetings will return to the Thoreson House Museum. I hope you can attend. Your presence tells us the work we are doing matters to you and to our community.

As members of the Westby Area Historical Society, please continue to help us in our mission to collect, preserve, promote, and communicate the history of Westby. We cannot do this without you! Donate, volunteer, and continue your membership — your participation will help us be successful!



Shining a Light on the Past

We just finished "101 Years of Fun" with the Snowflake Ski Club so we thought this article, published on March 30, 1989 in *The Westby Times*, will trigger memories for some of you!

Ski hill near end of era


"Walkers along Bekkedal Avenue will soon be having their last look at a monument whose age is roughly set at 30 years—the junior ski jump.

Other winters the site has teamed with activity; shouts of joy for a good landing or moans of chagrin for a spill. Tournaments were held there. The road would be lined with cars as moms and dads watched potential champs on the 'Big" hill in Timber Coulee, or an Olympic contestant perhaps.

"The 30-meter hill was built in the early 60s by Elgin Herbeck of Hillsboro, a steel worker," according to Alden Fremstad, a life-long ski enthusiast. The late Leif Mikkelson and Noble Stendahl were two Alden remembers who also were involved in construction.

It replaced a ski hill, now long gone, which stood at the back of Davidson Park in what was then Ulland Valley.

At one point active members decided the take-off on the junior hill was too high so Alden and Glen Stakston rebuilt and lowered it. A warming house or lunch stand was built in later years where ski moms took turns providing hamburgers and hot chocolate." Editor's note: This Shining a Light ... article, featuring the below photo, shared that the Snowflake Ski Club helped finance the construction of the Syverson Park slide with a gift of \$7,000!



We are going to be so happy driving through Westby in the Fall of 2025 but until then we'll need a lot of patience. (Remember how things were during the construction of the Uff Da Bahn?) The Main Street project will start this spring after the weather breaks. When construction is well underway during June, July and August, you will only be able to get to the Thoreson House Museum from the south on Bekkedal Avenue, coming from the view you see in the photo above. It will take a bit of maneuvering depending on what stage of construction is going on but it will certainly be possible. 
35 YEARS of the WESTBY AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY!

We have a lot to celebrate in 2024! On March 19, 1989, Dorothy Krause, director of the Vernon County Historical Society, met with Ray Bakkum, Robert Becker (Editor of the Westby Times), Julda Call, Elaine Lund, Alma Mikkelson, and Cloie Neprud to discuss the formation of a historical society in Westby. After that meeting, The Times published photos and a short blurb on the front page of the paper asking people to join their efforts. Now, 35 years later, we have over 100 members, a beautiful museum building, and an amazing collection of artifacts that you can see in very professional displays. We are serious about our association with the Wisconsin Historical Society, our practice of museum standards, and our appreciation of our members, donors, and volunteers. We have worked hard to provide countless programs and presentations for schools, nursing homes, local churches, and community groups about "everything history" in the Westby area. We hope to continue this tradition of excellence and professionalism for another 35 years!
