In April 1989, the Westby Times let everyone know that they were welcome to attend the historical society organizational meeting, to become a member, to volunteer to be on the ballot of officers, and to help write the bylaws. Today, we follow those same principles to be open and welcoming to all!

WAHS was busy this year bringing the most and best activities to Westby to celebrate Syttende Mai! We started with press releases and a bit of history in articles published in the local newspaper. We introduced Kathy Volden as the 2024 Grandmother of the Year at the All-City Band Concert on May 15. We presented three programs to Westby and Coon Valley 4th grade classes, explaining why we celebrate

Syttende Mai. We rotated through the entire Westby Elementary School student body during 4 sessions for a total of more than 250 students — with rave reviews from the teachers, we might add — when we presented our bunad program. Saturday from 9 to 2:30 and Sunday from 11 until 1:30, we sold our traditional lefse/pølse and sold out both days. On Saturday morning, we had board members conducting tours at the museum — for the largest number of guests ever! Saturday afternoon we co-hosted a cultural program with Country Coon Prairie Church Preservation to what we understand was the largest audience for any speaker this year. Sunday brought the *Grandmother* and the *Sweet Rides* entries in the Big Parade. All the while, we were posting on Facebook to be sure people were aware of what WAHS was offering! We certainly had a great turnout and excellent comments about the quality

of our activities. We received sincere appreciation for what we do to collect, preserve


WAHS AWARDS SCHOLARSHIP
