DOT plans lane change by weekend

With the construction of the new Hwy. 14/61/27 four-lane corridor between the cities of Westby and Viroqua nearing completion, the Wisconsin DOT will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 30, regarding the study and mapping of future bypasses around the two communities. The meeting will be held from 5 - 7 p.m. at Western Technical College - Viroqua, 220 S. Main St., Viroqua.

The proposed bypasses are part of a WisDOT long-range development study and consist of preserving and officially mapping the right-of-way for a four-lane bypass of Viroqua and Westby The Westby bypass limits extend approximately 3.6 miles from Sherpe Road to Cut-A-Cross Road.

We brought uniforms that are always on display in our museum Military Honors Room as a visual highlight for these ceremonies. The uniforms had been worn by Stanley Hoilien (WWI Army), Hilmer Anderson (WWII Navy), David Thoreson (Air Force), Roberta LaDue (Marines), and Mark Olson (Army Operation Iraqi Freedom). It was wonderful for the uniforms to get deserved recognition and to have such a dramatic impact on the audience!

Repairs and improvements to the museum!

Thank goodness for members and volunteers who can do the work or recommend great service people! Since our last newsletter, we have done a few things. First, the basement walls were professionally sprayed. The stone was flaking, which would eventually cause problems. With a layer of foam insulation over the stone, we will be good for years to come! Next, when the furnace was serviced this fall, we found out the blower motor was dying. The technician suggested we replace it before it became an emergency, so we did that. He also suggested a "smart" thermostat because we aren't at the museum every day. WAHS member Garland is very tech-savvy and was able to do that for us. Now, several members will monitor the building virtually this winter so someone will always be available if there is a problem. Then, because we have never liked the lights on the sign that was put in several years ago, we had a new light installed. It has LED bulbs that shine from below and are much brighter than the previous ones. Now, the sign can be seen and read much more easily at night. Finally, our WiFi router died. We were very lucky that Garland could also replace that because the museum can't be without the internet, especially with our new "smart" thermostat. There's always something but because of our successful fundraisers and events, we were able to do everything!

Our 35th Anniversary Party was a big success!

On March 19, 1989, Dorothy Krause, then director of the Vernon County Historical Society, met with Ray Bakkum, Robert Becker (Editor of the Westby Times), Julda Call, Elaine Lund, Alma Mikkelson, and Cloie Neprud to discuss the formation of a historical society in Westby. It was recommended that they contact the Wisconsin Historical Society and on June 5, 1989, the first annual meeting of WAHS was held. The first elected Board of Directors was President Walter Buros, Vice President Margaret Garlick, Secretary Katherine Anderson, Treasurer Orin Larson, and directors David Vossetieg, Dorothy Krause, Elaine Lund, Ingrid Sadler, and Lorraine Borgen.

In 1881, Theodore and Katherine (Bekkedal) Thoreson moved their family to Westby, purchasing two and one-half acres of land. Theodore and his father, Ole, began a lumber and contract business in 1884. It was in 1892 that they built the Victorian house that is now the WAHS Thoreson House Museum and Genealogy Center. The influence of their construction business is evident in the use of various wood within the house. The inlaid living room floor, the bird's eye maple woodwork, the pocket doors between the living room and dining room, and the beautiful staircase spindles are original. The Westby Area Historical Society purchased the house from John and Leah Walker on October 1, 1993, for \$65,000 to create the museum. The mortgage for the museum was paid off in August 2006, and since that time, many improvements have been made to make the building a usable museum space. Since 1989, 16 people have served as WAHS president, Blaine Hedberg serving longest at 7 years. The first "History Keepers" newsletter was published in 1994 and the current editor, Kathy Anderson, has served longest in that position for 10 years. On Sunday, September 10th, we had a party to celebrate the organization, the museum, and the collection!
