Shining a Light on the Past


Because WAHS was recently so involved with the Norwegian-American Language Research Project, we thought you might like to read about Norwegian being spoken in Westby. This article is from The Times, December 24, 1970 issue.

Norwegian Christmas Service Broadcast

Christmas services direct from Norway will be heard on Christmas Day over WISV Viroqua. The full hour program begins at 1:30 p.m., December 25, with Pastor Haakon E. Andersen, General Secretary, Norwegian Lutheran Church; organist is Helge Dahl.

Norwegian services on Christmas Day have become a tradition in our region, having been presented each year over WISV since 1964.

Arrangements are coordinated by S. Scott Lee of Coon Valley in cooperation with the Norwegian Broadcasting system and with broadcast time provided by Gilbertson-Seland of Coon Valley, and Constalie Plumbing Company of Westby. Volunteers of the Year



At our November member meeting, VP John and *Sweet Rides* chairperson Garland presented the 2025 Volunteer of the Year Award to the members of our Pie Crew who could attend. This year, for the 10th annual *Sweet Rides*, about 30 people made and served 100 pies. Mixing flour and butter for the dough from scratch, hand-rolling the pie crust, washing and cutting fresh fruit, and cooking pie filling with special spices for delicious flavor — they worked together for 4 days before the car show, making sure our pies were the freshest and most delicious they could be!

This team has been working together for so many years that they are now a well-oiled machine. Each person has a "favorite" job that assures quality and consistency for every pie that is served.

The overwhelming number of people who attend *Sweet Rides & Sweet Pies* comment that it's great to see so many cool cars, but the pie is what brings them to the show. Thank you, Pie Crew, for making this event a huge success that is getting bigger and better every year!

Lifetime Achievement Award

In 2015, the members of the Westby Area Historical Society unanimously voted to establish a WAHS Lifetime Achievement Award. This distinction recognizes individuals who have shown outstanding dedication and commitment to WAHS; whose continuing contributions strengthen the mission of WAHS; and whose endeavors have had a lasting impact on our organization.

The Board of Directors is pleased to present our fourth Lifetime Achievement Award to Elaine Olson. In 2014, Elaine received the Volunteer of the Year Award, but she was so much more. Elaine dedicated her time, her passion for artifacts and their authenticity, her organizational skills, and her efforts toward fundraising. She even painted and decorated the museum. Her special touches for the Christmas and other fundraising events made those occasions so memorable. We will never be able to thank Elaine enough for her contributions to our organization.

Though given posthumously, the Board of Directors hopes that this honor will show her family and our community how she helped make a strong foundation for WAHS; how she provided invaluable assistance in the day-to-day activities and maintenance of WAHS; and how the future of the society is secure because of her efforts. Elaine made it her purpose "to collect, preserve, promote, and communicate the history, culture, and heritage of the Westby, WI area for current and future generations." We are proud and fortunate that she chose WAHS to be the beneficiary of her passion and efforts in Westby for history and community service.

WAHS Helps Norwegian Researchers!

During the week of October 13, researchers from Norway visited WAHS, asking for "as many as you can get" people to interview. They wanted Norwegian-speaking people who were born and raised in WI. When they left Norway, their goal was to interview 1 or 2 people in each of +/- 10 cities. Over 4 days and 30 hours at our Thoreson House Museum, they were able to talk with 25 people and get 16 recorded interviews, describing our help as "extremely productive!" Several of the stops they made before coming to Westby were less than stellar because viable subjects were not available for interviews, and they were getting worried about meeting their goal. Because of their success in Westby, they expected to go home with 24 or 25 interviews, so we did our Norwegian heritage proud!

The team of researchers was Professor David Natvig, who grew up around Madison and was educated at UW-Madison in Scandinavian Studies. He has lived in Stavanger for 8 years and works at the University of Stavanger; Sophia Haave, who is a student at the University of Stavanger working toward her PhD; and Professor Arnstein Hjelde. Many people in this area know Arnstein as he has been visiting Westby for almost 40 years, coming every 3 to 5 years. He has interviewed and recorded Norwegian-speaking people throughout the United States and especially enjoys coming to our area. He said that people in Westby and Coon Valley speak with a uniform Old Norwegian Gudbrandsdal dialect that has changed very little since the early days of immigration. Arnstein is a professor in the Department of Languages, Literature and Culture at Østfold University College. David invited him to come on this trip because of his language research background and interviewing experience.

The team explained that the purpose of their research is to "examine the intonation, or 'melody,' of the sing-song flow of Norwegian spoken in the Upper Midwest. It is important to the Norwegian-American cultural history and immigration story, and will tell what structures are robust, which are fragile, and what survives because language is what makes us human." The team explained that there are only 3 other worldwide studies of this kind that they know of. Their project is being funded by the Research Council of Norway and the University of Stavanger.

WAHS Visitors

In the first 10 months of 2025, 4,450 people have visited our website. More than 450 visitors from all over Wisconsin, 9 other states, and 10 cities in Norway have physically toured our museum! We also have more than 1,300 Facebook followers. In the last 90 days, we've had more than 194,400 "views" and more than 4,000 "interactions" with our posts. WAHS is getting noticed!

We've answered many genealogy research questions and general Westby history requests, talked to tour groups about Westby history, given tours of the museum, done our Fall Cemetery Stone Cleaning Workshop, displayed "Slooper" materials at the library, and done furnace maintenance. Below are more things we have been doing!

Nina, John and Blaine set up a table at the Westby Walkabout on Thursday, 9/25. It was a beautiful evening and proved to be a successful couple of hours. They generated a lot of interest in the organization and even made some money selling lefse/pølse!

The Westby Chamber asked members to decorate lamp posts in town for an October fall festive look and to be entered in a contest. Our decorations in front of the creamery retail store showed pictures of Westby's famous "firsts" with an explanation on the back of each photo and why we chose that person.

WAHS VP "Fireman" John Erlandson and Nina Healy set up the WAHS trick-or-treat table at City Hall. The location was safer than having the kiddos walk across Main Street to the museum so they could hand out more than 1,000 pieces of candy and glow-in-the-dark bracelets.

The American Legion/VFW Veterans Day program was enhanced by 5 uniforms we brought from our museum. WWI Army Stanley Hoilien, WWII Navy Hilmer Anderson, Korea Air Force David Thoreson, Marine uniform of Roberta LaDue, and Mark Olson's Iragi Freedom fatigues. Invited by the late Tom Sharratt last year, it's now an annual activity for WAHS! We then moved the uniforms to the WAPAC so a full house could see the uniforms during the Westby High School Choir's glorious patriotic evening concert!
