I am Sergeant Nichols I served in the Army for 7 1/2 Years did two tours to Afghanistan 09-10 and 2011 for my first tour I was with 10th mountain light infantry 1-32. During my time at 1-32 I was a Rifleman with an M4, Saw Gunner with the M249 and the MK48 Machineguns, and was a gunner with a 50cal in the turret. During my first tour we were in Kunar Provence and Nuristan for the battle of Barg-e Matal. In my 2nd tour I was with 2-34 out of Fort Riley KS we got sent to Kandahar I was a AG for the 240B on July 4th 2011 I stepped on an IED I was a limb salvage for many years with multiple surgeries until I made the decision to have an amputation because of many complications I was having medically. I have received a Purple Heart, Arcom with Valor.

I got to shoot the Gen 2 Gali from Alamo Defense Labs for the first time over the weekend, I haven't shot like that in many years, It did have some weight to it picking it up for the first time more than the M4. It took little time to learn everything needed for the Galil, shooting it felt like second nature the trigger pull did not feel heavy, I did shoot the Galil with aid and no aid, when shooting with no aid I barely felt the recoil, I was able to hold it in the ready up position for a period of time. doing a magazine change in the ready up position was simple like changing the magazine on a M4. Now with using aid while shooting the 338 caliber or the supersonic rounds. I able to shoot a magazine of sub-munition to a magazine of supersonic without making any adjustments to the Galil. With the surpressor on the Galil I did not need ear protection, I was able to shoot multiple times different magazines without a problem. Supersonic was louder than the sub-munition but it had the same loudness as a m4 when shooting. it still looked clean after spending an entire morning shooting.

After spending time with the Galil I would Recommend this weapon for enthusiast, hunters, self defense even the military it was just an all around great weapon to shoot.
