All a Matter of Perspective- Pastor Jack

This month is typically one of beginnings. The month begins with Labor Day. I grew up in Michigan, where for a long time it was legislated that school could not begin until after Labor Day. We think of school, Sunday School, Bible studies and other groups that begin a new session this time of year. Here at Abiding Savior we will also offer Confirmation this month, which has been delayed for a variety of reasons. One can only wonder what goes through the minds particularly of our young people at such milestones, especially in light of them being changed or even possibly eliminated.

‘O Ye Jigs and Juleps’ is a wonderful little book of short essays written in 1904 by Virginia Cary Hudson, when she was a ten-year-old student at an Episcopal boarding school. Her thoughts on “Sacraments” and “Etiquette at Church,” excerpted below, reflect a different time, but the point of view is timeless.

“Sacraments are what you do in Church. When you are little somebody carries you in church on a pillow; and you come out a child of God and inheritor of the Kingdom of Heaven. They pour water on your head and that’s a sacrament. When you are twelve you walk back in yourself with your best dress and shoes on, and your new prayer book your mother buys you, and you walk up to the Bishop, and he stands up, and you kneel down, and he mashes your head, and you are an Episcopal. Then you are supposed to increase in spirit. Then everybody kisses you and that’s a sacrament. Only I left out the bread and wine. That’s a sacrament, too. I tasted some of the bread in the choir room and it tasted like my goldfish wafers.

“Before I go into the house of the Lord with praise and thanksgiving I lift up mine eyes unto the town clock from whence cometh the time to see if I am late. It is not etiquette to be late. The first thing you do is kneel down and thank the Lord for your mother and your father and your lovely wallpaper. Then you can sit and look around just a little bit. Don’t turn around and look. That is not etiquette.

“Kneel when you pray, stand when you sing, and sit when you listen. Don’t try to drink up all of the wine at the altar rail. That is not etiquette. Leave some for other people. Never punch people in church, or giggle or cross your legs. Crossing your legs is as bad as scratching or walking in front of people or chewing gum or saying damn. Don’t lose your place in the prayer book. Bow for the cross and for the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. When the choir marches back to the Vestry room and the minister calls out goodbye to the Lord until next Sunday, then you can speak to people.

“Etiquette is what you are doing and saying when people are looking and listening. What you are thinking is your business. Thinking is not etiquette. Hallelujah, thine the glory. Revive us again.

“P.S. If you want to stay awake in church, go to bed early Saturday night. After you are confirmed your sponsors in Baptism can't be blamed for what you do. You are on your own then and if the devil gets you, it is your own fault and serves you just right. Amen and the Lord have mercy.”

This year, 2021, may offer many new perspectives on various aspects of life. One thing we know is constant, and that is God's love and care for all His children. May we celebrate His consistent love, mercy and grace now and forever.

Musical Ensembles & Opportunities

- The Chancel Choir meets 6:30 – 8:30 pm on Wednesday nights, preparing music regularly for worship including service music, anthems, chants, etc. and reports at 7:30 am Sunday mornings to sing as part of the 8:00 am Sunday morning worship service.
- The Praise Team meets Wednesday afternoons from 4:30– 6:00 pm on Wednesday afternoon/evenings, preparing music regularly for worship including service music, praise anthems, etc. and reports at 10:00 am Sunday morning to play and sing as part of the 10:45 am Sunday morning worship service.
- The Chime Ensemble meets Thursdays (time TBD) and is an excellent place for new musicians to learn the rudiments and fundamentals of music and group music making. The ensemble prepares special music for worship from time to time.
- The Brass Ensemble meets Thursdays (time TBD) and any players of brass instruments (trumpet, horn, trombone, baritone/euphonium, tuba, etc.) are welcome to join. The ensemble meets regularly and prepares music as needed for worship and special events.
- Are you a keyboardist (piano, organ, etc.) and interested in playing preludes or voluntaries in worship from time to time? You are invited to express your interest and a list of pieces you would like to offer, and when appropriate (based on season and service content), play during worship as a guest pianist/organist. It is never too soon or too late to contemplate using God's gifts of talent in worship of Him!
- Are you a vocalist but can't participate in choir? There are wonderful ways you can be included as a soloist! Please let us know if you're interested.

Worship Technology/ Logistics Opportunities
