

Our History




- Our school was founded in Bogotá, Colombia in 2023.

Schedules

What are schedules like with ELC?

We offer part time work to our teachers. A typical student has 3-4 classes per week. Each teacher has 3-4 students. This works out to be 9-16 hours of class per week.



You get to choose which student schedules you accept. Let's look at an example:

A student comes to us and wants to have class on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 6pm. —> We tell you about the student and the schedule, and you can accept, offer a change, or state that you are unavailable for that schedule.



Student Onboarding



This is the process of onboarding students for our teachers:

Step 1: The student comes to us, tells us their story, their goals, and the study schedule they are looking for.


Step 2: We organize the student's info into you Teacher Folder and share this info with you, confirming the schedule and start date.

Step 3: You will have the student's WhatsApp and email. You will send them a message introducing yourself, confirming the schedule, and sending the Google Meet link for your classes.

Class Content

What kind of material will you teach in the classes?

Class Agenda:



Warm Up: Practice vocabulary, spelling, grammar, review past topics, etc.

Main Lesson: Practice conversation, interview skills, writing an email, etc.

End: If time allows, practice vocabulary with games, puzzles, etc.





Class Material: ELC Folder



As the teacher, you know your student best. You will create their personalized lessons and notes.

However, this does not mean that you are alone. In the main ELC Teacher folder, you will find hundreds of detailed lessons, many that can even be copied and pasted to your notes. These are proven lessons popular with students.

Pay Structure



Here, we outline the pay structure for classes:

Step 1: You teach a class, the duration of which will be 1-2 hours.

Step 2: You mark in the attendance sheet for that student or group that you taught the duration of class, the student(s) who were present, and the date of the class.

**Hours are taken for each student from the 29th to the 28th of each month. Payment is made from the 1st to the 5th of each new month.

Example: You teach a student throughout the month of May. On May 28th, we remind you to actualize and update all of your attendance sheets. On May 29th, we count all of your completed hours in the month of May (and April 29th/30th). We pay the total hours counted for all of your students from this period on the 3rd of June.
