ABOUT US

Behind the Science Safaris was born from a powerful question: millions of people come to Africa each year, but the wildlife they're coming to see is disappearing. How can we translate this obvious interest in wildlife, into something that also helps protect it?

This idea took root in KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa, where **Dr. Camille Fritsch**, a behavioral ecologist studying *hippopotamus social dynamics*, spent years immersed in the bush, living and working along the region's rivers and reserves. As a Californian in South Africa, he developed a deep appreciation for the complexity and beauty of wild ecosystems in Africa, and witnessed firsthand the chronic underfunding of conservation efforts.



These experiences sparked a vision for a different kind of safari: one that offers

meaningful, up-close encounters with nature while directly supporting real conservation work - and the scientists behind it.

What emerged is **Behind the Science Safaris**: a conservation-centered safari that blends the best luxury lodges and gastronomy with immersive access in wildlife research.

"Our trips are designed to give you a meaningful and unforgettable safari experience - one that goes beyond game drives and into the heart of the conservation work happening on the ground." - Dr. Camille Fritsch

Each safari supports active research projects protecting endangered and often overlooked species — like Crowned Eagles to rhinos and even reptiles. Species face extinction because critical research isn't happening: there simply isn't enough funding to cover researcher salaries and research budgets.

By joining a Behind the Science Safari, you help provide crucial support that allows scientists to continue their essential work studying and protecting animals on the brink. Your visit directly contributes to filling this funding gap and making sure conservation efforts don't stop where they're needed most.

You'll also get to meet the researchers **Behind the Science**, sharing meals, field visits, and conversations that bring their work — and the challenges facing these species — to life. For travelers who want more than just sightseeing, we offer a chance to explore the wild while also becoming part of the story that keeps it alive.



Days 1-2

Arrival: King Shaka AirportAccommodation: Canelands Beach Club & SpaActivities: HikingKey Species: African Crowned Eagles,

Reptiles, Wildebeest, Vervet Monkeys

Arrive and unwind at Canelands Beach Club & Spa, perched above the Indian Ocean in the coastal town of Ballito enjoy your first South African sunset while sipping on local wines.



Meet Dr. Shane McPherson, lead researcher of the **Durban African Crowned Eagle Project**. Over dinner, he'll share stories and insights into his work. These raptors are the most powerful birds on the planet, known to hunt prey many times their size. Remarkably, urban Durban hosts the densest population of Crowned Eagles in the world. Dr. McPherson has spent over a decade studying their behavior, nesting patterns, and resilience in city ecosystems.

Wake up to a chorus of songbirds and monkeys in the coastal forest. After a relaxed breakfast or a sunrise beach walk, we travel to *Tanglewood Nature Reserve* in the Durban suburb, Kloof, for a guided field experience with Dr. McPherson's team. We'll hike through endangered KwaZulu-Natal Sour Veld and Coastal Rainforest environments, to reach a secluded Crowned Eagle nest site. From an expert-selected vantage point, we'll observe nest activity and help collect key data for the team's long-term breeding study.

Behind the scenes: The exact nest we'll visit was featured in the acclaimed 2023 PBS series Raptors: Fists Full of Daggers, and is one of 90 nests Shane and his team monitor each year!

After a catered lunch beneath the lychee and avocado trees, we meet Nick Evans, herpetologist and founder of **KZN Amphibian & Reptile Conservation**. Known from DSTV's *Snake Season*, Nick makes the world of reptiles accessible and exciting.



We can all agree that we know someone scared of snakes. Learn how Nick is changing the narrative on reptiles in Durban, and engaging those most in need, in reptile conservation. You'll return home with new knowledge, including a deeper understanding of the vital roles reptiles play in ecosystems.

* For those less reptile-inclined, this activity can be enjoyed from a respectful distance.



Days 3-4

Shuttle: 2.5 hrs from Ballito to St. Lucia

Accommodation: St. Lucia Urban Glamping Activities: Hiking, Sunset Hippo River Cruise, Big 4 Game Drive, Turtle Nest Survey Key Species: Birds, Hippos, Zebra, Antelope Wonder.



Traveling up the East Coast into the wild beauty of KwaZulu-Natal, we arrive at St. Lucia, home to **iSimangaliso Wetland Park**, South Africa's first proclaimed UNESCO World Heritage Site. Meaning "the place of miracle and wonder" in isiZulu, iSimangaliso truly lives up to its name with eight interwoven ecosystems, 25,000-year-old coastal forests, and 220 kilometers of untouched shoreline.

Our days here are spent hiking through ancient forests, cruising the estuary at sunset, and exploring savannahs on game drives. With a local guide, we learn how this rare ecosystem supports buffalo, hippos, crocodiles, bull sharks, and over 500 bird species. If we're lucky, we may spot elephants, rhinos, and perhaps even a leopard or hyena.



The town of **St. Lucia**, with its 2,000 human residents and 1,000 hippos, is one of the few places on Earth where hippos roam the streets at night. Hippos, or "Imvubu" in isiZulu, hold a special place in our founder Dr. Camille Fritsch's heart. With over ten years dedicated to pioneering research on hippo behavior and ecology, Dr. Camille's work inspired the creation of BTS Safari's to support conservation projects focused on endangered and often overlooked species in KwaZulu-Natal.



In the evening, we take a night drive to Cape Vidal to join local turtle experts tracking nesting Leatherback and Loggerhead sea turtles. If we're lucky, we may witness hatchlings breaking through the sand and returning to the ocean under a sky full of stars.



<u>Day 5-7</u>

Shuttle: 2 hours to Hluhluwe Reserve Accommodation: Remote Bush Camp Activities: Hiking Safari Key Species: Elephants, Rhinos, Zebra, Giraffe

Leaving St. Lucia, we head to **Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Park**, Africa's oldest nature reserve and home to the *Big Five*. Over the next few days, we'll embark on a multi-day hiking safari, getting up close to wildlife on foot - an unforgettable way to reconnect with nature.

We will be guided by Sicelo Mbatha, a world-renowned wilderness guide born just outside the protected area who has been leading groups on foot in Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Park for over 30 years! His knowledge of the region, Zulu culture, and human-animal connection will be a truly unique experience. Through Sicelo's deep knowledge of plants and animals, you'll be drawn into the powerful spiritual bond the Zulu people share with nature. Along the way, we'll learn Zulu



words and folklore and experience something truly unique.

Hiking routes will be tailored to the group's pace and take into account weather, ensuring a rewarding adventure for everyone. We'll spend two nights glamping in comfort under the stars, waking to the songs of over 600 bird species.





<u>Day 7-9</u>

Shuttle: 1.5 hours to King Shaka Airport
Hotel: Leopard Mountain Safari Lodge
Activities: Game Drives, Wildlife ACT
Conservation, Elephant Experience
Key Species: Elephants, Rhinos, Lions, Warthogs

Our final days are spent at the beautiful *Leopard Mountain Safari Lodge* in **Manyoni Game Reserve**, where each luxury tent offers sweeping 360° views of the savannah. Between early morning and evening game drives, you can choose to unwind at the spa, take a dip in the pool, or simply soak in the sounds of the bush from your private deck.



You'll join forces with *Wildlife ACT* - winner at the global responsible travel awards. Through hands-on conservation work, you'll learn about their critical effort to protect rhinos from poaching, an unfortunate but ongoing threat in the region. With thousands of rhinos still killed each year for their horn, you'll gain rare insight into the dehorning process, a last-resort method conservationists use to deter poachers. You'll also discover how KwaZulu-Natal wildlife management authority played a key role in bringing white rhinos back from the brink of extinction just over a century ago. One of our final highlights is a visit to *Bayete Zulu* to meet Rambo and Rachel - two free-roaming elephants who, incredibly, choose to interact with people. You'll hear the heartwarming story of their unique bond, feel their tusks, feed them, and even try (and fail!) to beat them in a water-drinking race. They can gulp 5 gallons in the time it takes you to finish your bottle.



As we head back to Durban, it's time to say farewell - nine unforgettable days after this African adventure began. What started as a group of strangers has become a community connected by shared awes, laughter, stories around campfires, and moments that will live long in our hearts.

You've walked among giants, stood still in silence as the sun rose over the savannah, and witnessed conservation in action. You've learned local traditions, made an important contribution to saving wildlife for the future and hopefully, felt a deeper connection to nature and your place within it.

Below are a few highly recommended add-ons to complement your Safari and deepen your experience of South Africa.

Cape Town's Table Mountain

No trip to South Africa is complete without a visit to the iconic Table Mountain, towering 3,563 feet above sea level and offering sweeping views of Cape Town, the Atlantic Ocean, and beyond. Located within Table Mountain National Park, this flat-topped natural wonder is best experienced via the rotating Table Mountain Aerial Cableway, which carries visitors to the 2-mile-wide summit in just five minutes.



Travel Tip: Weather conditions at the top can change quickly. High winds or fog often cause delays or temporary closures of the cableway.

Plan a stay of at least two days in Cape Town to maximize your chance of reaching the summit. Don't forget to bring a jacket — it's often much cooler at the top!

Stellenbosch Wine Region

Just 45 km (28 miles) from Cape Town, the Stellenbosch Wine Region is South Africa's second-oldest wine-producing area, first planted in 1679. While Constantia may hold the title of the oldest, Stellenbosch is undoubtedly the most renowned, both for its wines and its stunning setting.

Cradled by the Helderberg, Simonsberg, and Stellenbosch Mountains, and influenced by the cool coastal breezes of nearby False Bay, the region offers the perfect conditions for producing complex, award-winning wines.
