Food Help

Find food banks and information on free emergency food pantries.

Local food banks and free food pantries are a great place to turn to for assistance. The locations will pass out free food, groceries, personal hygiene supplies and other forms of non-financial support. Millions of individuals and families are struggling with feeding their families on a consistent basis, and a pantry is a great place to turn to for assistance even today. While maybe in some months most people are fine, there can be other periods of time due to an unexpected bill or reduction in income that can make it more challenging. In an emergency, a free food pantry (which are listed below) may be able to help.

Many low to moderate income families also struggle to keep food on their tables due to the escalating cost of basic items. Tens of millions of people receive some type of food assistance from these centers every year. The agencies help feed the working poor, families living in poverty, as well as even moderate-income households. Never hesitate to ask or stop by a location as the goal is to reduce or prevent hunger. Information is provided below on food banks and distribution centers that are located near you and that may be open today.

Food pantries are run by a wide range of organizations. There can be centers located at local charities, non-profits, and even government affiliated agencies. For example, many churches will have a food pantry or soup kitchen on site. Organizations like the Salvation Army or Catholic Charities may run a center at their local branches. Even if a social service agency does not operate a free food pantry, they can usually refer the applicant to a location in their community.

The exact type of assistance offered to qualified individuals will depend on the food bank. Some will provide bread, vegetables, baby formula, frozen food, and perishables today. Other centers may just have free canned goods and other basic groceries to applicants facing a crisis. They also try to also meet any dietary needs of children or senior citizens.

In addition, other forms of non-financial support may be offered. These tend to be more limited, but they are a possibility. Items such as clothes, personal hygiene items, Christmas and Thanksgiving meals, and diapers. An individual will just need to call the distribution center near them to get the specifics on the food assistance programs administered.

Assistance programs that may be offered at emergency food pantries

In addition to information on the food pantries listed below, families have other places to turn to for help today. As one focus will always be to prevent hunger, especially for children as well as the elderly. So if and when you are struggling, there are a number of resources available. Some of those options include:

Government food assistance programs – The federal government runs a large number of assistance programs for the low income as well as families living in poverty. There may also be help from state as well as county organizations. They are available across the nation. More on government food assistance programs.

Salvation Army food pantry assistance programs - This is one of the nation's leading charities. The Christian faith-based charity supports people regardless of their religion, race, immigration status or age. Free food banks, soup kitchens, emergency financial support and other feeding programs are located at each local center. They help the poor, indigent, immigrants, and struggling families. Holiday food, both at Christmas and Thanksgiving, is available from many food banks and pantries. Some provide free groceries as well as ingredients, or entire meals, along with small gifts or toys. Or they hold parties and gatherings for the entire family.

Womens Infant Children - WIC – This in another popular government assistance program for low income individuals. Of particular emphasis is on ensuring newborns as well as pregnant mothers get the nutrition they need. Free or low cost baby formula, food items, and other nutritional support is available, often in the form of vouchers or debit cards.
