

SPOTLIGHT: HYGIENE KITS FOR CONFERENCE





One hand towel (15x25 - 17x27 inches)

no kitchen cleaning or microfiber towels

One washcloth

no kitchen, cleaning or microfiber cloths

One comb

must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth no pocket combs or picks

rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6" of teeth




One toenail or fingernail clipper

no emery boards or metal nail files

Bath-size bar of soap (3 oz. or larger)

no Ivory or Jergen's brands

do not remove from packaging



do not remove from packaging personal advertising not acceptable

10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches)

common household bandages acceptable

One one-gallon size resealable bag (provided)

Assembly Instructions:

Lay hand towel flat on a table

Lay washcloth in center of hand towel

Place all other items on top of washcloth

Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items Grasp bundle tightly and roll over remainder of towel

Place tightly rolled bundle in plastic bag and seal

Other Notes:

All items must be new

Do not wash any items

Do not include personal notes, money or other materials

Contents should not have cartoon characters,

advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols

The bags with instructions will be handed out on May 1st and need to be returned to the church by May 29th. The toothpaste and shipping costs will be taken care of, so there is no need to include money in your kits.

Life Line Screening goes beyond regular checkups to provide a more thorough look at your health.

Adults age 50+ and those 40 and older with one or more risk factors for cardiovascular disease should be screened.

*Key Risk Factors include: high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, obesity, smoking, and family history.
