- We will be out in the community to help with the distribution of food by the Chesterfield Food Bank at A.M. Davis Elementary School on $May\ 14$. And we will continue to offer food through the Blessing Box.
- We will make sandwiches regularly for RVA Hand Up of Chesterfield serving the homeless in Richmond.
- We will also collect hygiene kits for annual conference, due by May 29. These kits are distributed to those displaced by disasters in the United States.
- We will continue to collect greeting cards for residents of area nursing homes. Easter cards should be brought in by April 10.
- We will collect pillows for Safe Harbor during June.
