Greetings Hopewell United Methodist Church Family!!

As we begin a new calendar year, we all can look back at the many challenges we have faced, both personally and as a church. We are now entering our 10th month of the pandemic and the changes that have come because of it. We all long for the day that we can "get back to normal." But is that where God is calling us to? Is that a place where we have seen growth, not just in numbers, but in our spirituality?

Our relationship started in the midst of the pandemic and the church building having been closed down for 3 months. It was a challenging time to have a pastoral change and to be jumping into full-time ministry. However, in looking back over the last 6 months, I do not think I would have wanted it any other way. Yes, it would have been easier to come in and just pick up where things were. However, God provided us with an opportunity to pause, evaluate, and think about doing church differently. And in response, you have risen to the challenge!

The Healthy Church Team (HCT) began meeting in June as the Virginia Conference was laying out guidelines for congregations to begin gathering for worship in-person. When the guidelines were published, I asked the HCT, "Can we get these in place for my first Sunday in July?" It was not an easy task, but the team rose to the occasion and provided a safe environment to gather and worship as a family once again. And the response to those efforts has been encouraging with many Sundays having well over 40 in attendance.

While we are gathering in-person, we understood not everyone was able, or ready, to return. Therefore, the leadership also looked at ways we can reach those who are in high-risk categories or not comfortable with gathering in person. Seeing the long-term need to provide a quality in-person and virtual worship experience, the church has invested in technological enhancements for the sanctuary that include TV monitors to provide visuals to the worship service, and video cameras for live-streaming services and other events, and most recently added a call-in option for those without the internet.

2020 has certainly thrown a wrench into the way church was done, not just at Hopewell, but across the globe. However, the needs of the congregation and our community still remain. I am encouraged by the response from the leaders and members of the congregation, but there is still more to do. So, as we enter this new year, I encourage you to look for innovative ways we can provide the needs of those we have served previously. The missions committee will be meeting January 7 to begin planning out where to place our hands and feet in our community. If you know of a need that is not being met or have a mission that you would like others to share in, please let us know. Let's show the community that God is doing a new thing at Hopewell UMC!
