


# Curvy Jelly Roll Log Cabin

Finished Size 68 x 68"



## Fabric requirements:

**32 – 2 ½" Jelly Roll Strips**

**2 Yard for Light Patchwork and Inner Border**

**1 Yard Outer Border**

**5/8 Yard Binding (or use 7 Jelly Roll Strips)**

**Backing – 4 1/8 yards**

# Curvy Jelly Roll Log Cabin

## Cutting Instructions:

Take 16 of the jelly roll strips, open the fold, iron flat, and make the following sub-cuts from each strip.

12 ½, 9 ½, 6 ½, 3 ½, 2 ½ inches. You will now have 16 of each size piece.

Take the remaining 16 jelly roll strips, open the fold, iron flat, and make the following sub-cuts from each strip.

14 ½, 11 ½, 8 ½, 5 ½ inches. You will now have 16 of each size piece.

Light fabric – cut 25 @ 1 ½" the width of the fabric (WOF). Hint – you can keep the strips folded for quicker cutting.

Take 8 of the strips and make the following sub-cuts from each.

2@ 11 ½ and 2@8 ½ inches. You will now have 16 of each size piece.

Take 8 of the strips and make the following sub-cuts from each.

2@12 ½ and 2@ 6 ½ inches. You will now have 16 of each size piece.

Take 8 of the strips and make the following sub-cuts from each.

2@9 ½, 2@ 5 ½, 2@3 ½ inches. You will now have 16 of each size piece.

Take the last strip and sub-cut 16 @ 2 ½" pieces.

Inner border – cut 7 @ 2 ½" WOF

Outer border – cut 7 @ 4 ½" WOF

## Sewing Instructions:

Select one of each size piece of the darker prints cut from the jelly roll, and one of each size piece cut from the light print. Use a variety of prints to help the block look scrappy!

Stitch piece #1 onto the center square. Finger press the seam allowances away from the center. Add piece #2 as shown in the picture shown on the next page, again pressing the seam allowances away from the center. Keep adding the strips in numerical order until the block is completed.



Repeat to make 16 blocks. Lay out the blocks as desired – there are lots of different patterns you can get by rotating the blocks.

Stitch blocks into rows, and stitch rows together.

Stitch inner border around all 4 sides of the quilt. Stitch outer border around all 4 sides of the quilt.

Quilt, bind, and enjoy!
