# **Cutting Instructions**

#### FABRIC A

- 1. Cut 1 strip 5" x WOF.
  - a. Cut the strip into 4 squares 5" x 5".
- 2. Cut 2 strips 3 3/8" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut the strips into 20 squares 3 %" x 3 %" (each strip can yield 11 squares).
- 3. Cut 1 strip 3" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut the strip into 8 squares 3" x 3" (if you like to oversize the triangles used in square in a square blocks, cut the strip and squares to 3 1/4" x 3 1/4").

### FABRIC B

- 1. Cut 1 strip 5 1/2" x WOF.
  - a. Cut the strip into 4 squares  $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " (if you like to oversize the pieces used in hourglass blocks, cut the strip and squares to  $5 \frac{3}{4}$ " x  $5 \frac{3}{4}$ ").
- 2. Cut 1 strip 5" x WOF.
  - a. Cut the strip into 5 squares 5" x 5".

# FABRIC C

- 1. Cut 1 strip 5 1/2" x WOF.
  - a. Cut the strip into 4 squares 5 ½" x 5 ½" (if you like to oversize the pieces used in hourglass blocks, cut the strips and squares to 5 ¾" x 5 ¾").
- 2. Cut 2 strips 5 3/8" x WOF.
  - a. Cut the strips into 9 squares 5 %" x 5 %" (each strip can yield 7 squares).
- 3. Cut 1 strip 2" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut the strip into 16 squares 2" x 2".

## FABRIC D

- 1. Cut 8 strips 4 1/2" x WOF.
  - a. Cut the strips into 64 squares 4 ½" x 4 ½" (each strip can yield 8 squares).

### BACKGROUND (bg) FABRIC

- 1. Cut 2 strips 5 1/2" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut the strips into 8 squares 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (each strip can yield 7 squares).

If you like to oversize the pieces used in hourglass blocks, cut the strips and squares to  $5 \, ^{3}/_{1}$  x  $5 \, ^{3}/_{1}$ ).

- 2. Cut 9 strips 4 1/2" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut 3 strips into 12 rectangles 4 ½" x 8 ½" (each strip can yield 4 rectangles).
  - b. Sub-cut 5 strips into 36 rectangles 4 ½" x 5" (each strip can yield 8 rectangles).
  - c. Sub-cut 1 strip into 5 squares 4 ½" x 4 ½".
- 3. Cut 1 strip 3 %" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut the strip into 4 squares 3 %" x 3 %".
- 4. Cut 6 strips 3" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut the strips into 76 squares 3" x 3" (each strip can yield 13 squares).

If you like to oversize the triangles used in square in a square blocks, you will instead need 3 strips 3"x WOF and 4 strips 3 1/4" x WOF.

Use the 3" strips to cut 36 squares 3"  $\times$  3" and the 3  $\frac{1}{4}$ " strips to cut 40 squares 3  $\frac{1}{4}$ "  $\times$  3  $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

- 5. Cut 22 strips 2" x WOF.
  - a. Sub-cut 12 strips into 24 rectangles 2" x 16  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (each strip can yield 2 rectangles).
  - b. Sub-cut 2 strips into 16 rectangles  $2'' \times 4 \frac{1}{2}''$  (each strip can yield 8 rectangles).
  - c. Reserve the remaining 8 strips.

#### BINDING

You can cut your binding into 7 strips  $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF now or after the quilt is finished.









### **Fabric Piece Labels**

You can use these labels to keep all of the cut pieces organized.

Fabric A 5" x 5" (4) Fabric A 3 %" x 3 %" (20) Fabric A 3" x 3" (3 ½" x 3 ½" if oversized) (8)

Fabric B 5 ½" x 5 ½" (5 ¾" x 5 ¾" if oversized) (4)

Fabric B 5" x 5" (5)

Fabric C 5 ½" x 5 ½" (5 ¾" x 5 ¾" if oversized) (4)

Fabric C 5 %" x 5 %" (9) Fabric C 2" x 2" (16)

Fabric D 4 ½" x 4 ½" (64)

Bg Fabric 5 ½" x 5 ½" (5 ¾" x 5 ¾" if oversized) (8)

Bg Fabric 4 ½" x 8 ½" (12) Bg Fabric 4 ½" x 5" (36) Bg Fabric 4 ½" x 4 ½" (5)

Bg Fabric 3 ¾" x 3 ¾" (4) Bg Fabric 3" x 3" (76)

<u>or if</u> oversized Bg Fabric 3" x 3" (36)

Bg Fabric 3 ½" x 3 ½" (40)

Bg Fabric 2" x 16 ½" (24) Bg Fabric 2" x 4 ½" (16)

Bg Fabric 8 strips 2" x WOF
