ORDINANCE NO. 1.6

ORDINANCE TO NAME ROADS CURRENTLY WITH MULTIPLE NAMES

The Town Board of the Town of Oakland, Douglas County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority under 82.03 (7), Wis. statutes, to adopt this ordinance. This ordinance was adopted by a majority of the town board on a roll call vote. A quorum was present. Proper notice having been given, establishes road names as follows:

SECTION 1 - THE ASSIGNMENT OF WEST LYMAN LAKE ROAD:

The road currently known by the names Amnicon Road, West Lyman Lake Road, and South Lyman Lake Road, which runs approximately 1.4 miles west from the south termination of Oliphant Road (all roads are within the Town of Oakland) shall now be named West Lyman Lake Road.

SECTION 2 - THE ASSIGNMENT OF SOUTH LYMAN LAKE ROAD:

The road currently known by the names South Lyman Lake Road and West Lyman Lake Road, which starts from County Highway L and runs west approximately 2.6 miles to the intersection with Oliphant Road, which is within the Town of Oakland, shall now be named South Lyman Lake Road.

SECTION 3 - ROAD SIGNS

The town chair, or his or her designee, shall erect road name signs at all intersections, as needed, to correct the names.

This ordinance is effective on posting or publishing. The town clerk shall properly post or publish this ordinance as required under s. 60.80, Wis. stats.
