Important Information on the Sylvania Schools Issue

Please find important information below regarding the Operating Levy for Sylvania Schools this coming spring. Your help to become informed and involved in the campaign will ensure our schools, and property values, stay strong.

- Sylvania Schools has placed an Operating Levy on the May 5th, 2026, ballot for the purposes of general operating expenses for the district.
- This Issue, if passed, generates approximately \$18 million annually for Sylvania Schools, and will be used for day-to-day operational expenses in the district, including instruction, student services, transportation, utilities, and the maintenance of our school facilities.
- Passage of this Issue would generate new funds for the district for the first time since 2016, stretching current dollars nearly 10 years for Sylvania Schools.
- Strong Schools keep our Property Values Strong! Data shows that well-funded, strong schools have homes that sell for higher values and appreciate at faster rates.
- Sylvania Schools has made a PRIORITY of tutoring, literacy, and enrichment over the last several years, recognizing that each and every child's education is important.
- Students can explore 14 Career Pathways in Sylvania Schools, including Medical Technologies, Firefighter and EMT Technician training, and Aerospace and Mechanical Engineering.
- Northview and Southview High Schools combine to offer more than 25 AP Courses to challenge our students with rigor and dynamic offerings.
- Community Pride and Support is strong in Sylvania Schools, and we ask for your continued efforts to keep our district strong!

Like many school districts across Ohio, Sylvania Schools continues to experience rising operational costs while existing revenues remain limited by state funding formulas and property-tax restrictions.
