The workshop commenced at 6:30 pm. The Board Members reviewed the Abstract, the Supervisor's, and Town Clerks Reports.

At 7:00pm Supervisor Kehl called the meeting to order with the Pledge to the Flag. Supervisor Kehl then requested a moment of silence to honor our military.

PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER CREATION OF A WATER DISTRICT (WATER DISTRICT 1):

Supervisor Kehl opened the public hearing.

New water lines will be installed on Dunbar Rd. continuing to the West to Rt. 98, North on Rt. 98 (Creek Rd) to the Attica Village Line connecting beyond the district to village lines. In addition, new lines from Dunbar Road will replace an existing line extending north to a point opposite prison property on Exchange St.

Justin has 17 signatures so far, we need 51% of the property owners and 50% of the assessed value, 32 - 33 signatures are needed.

New FEMA will not affect this process.

Mark Dadd a formal resolution will need to be approved next month.

The owner is responsible for water line installation from the house to the curb. Most meters will be outside.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR/PUBLIC CONCERNS:

Hans Walker was present to speak on behalf of the citizens group and thanked the board for their contribution to the citizens group. The funds are used for various trips.

Barb Higgins wants to know when the town will be able to take full access to the town hall?

Supervisor Kehl stated that the back of the building is in the process of being cleaned out.

ATTICA PACKAGE:

Joshua Wallace with Phillips Lytle, LLP was present and stated that he represents Attica Package and he would like to talk about the letter dated July 3, 2025. The letter is regarding the proposed laydown yard, mulching and compost site of the operation at 675 Gulf Rd.

Mr. Wallace stated that the proposed project is a permitted agricultural use in the AR District. The original zoning permit was denied stating it's not permissible in the AR District.

Mr. Wallace stated it is a permitted use under Ag/Markets law.

The site is 78 acres. According to the letter dated July 3, 2025 it states Attica Package is going to use approximately 30 acres for this proposed project. The site would receive materials intended for the mulching and digesting processes, including 3 retention ponds to recover, collect and recycle water for use in the processing of agricultural products and farm operation waste into mulch.

Mr. Wallace quoted various sections of the Ag/Markets law, and in Section 300-301 it provides protection for farm operations.

The 48 acres will continue to be used as agricultural fields for crops and growing and harvesting timber approximately 18 acres.

Joshua Wallace stated that they are asking for a response to the letter dated July 3, 2025.

Barb Higgins: The denial was done by the zoning board of appeals. The Town Planning Board has not received the proper paperwork to review this project. Attica Package was told they needed to do a land separation and they were told it needs to be changed to commercial and she checked with the Wyoming County Planning Board and what paperwork the town is requesting is correct.

Barb asked the owner if he is selling mulch products out of the current property?

The owner shook his head yes.

Barb Higgins: Are other products brought onto the parcel?

Attorney: Yes in addition to what's being done now, and there is no distinction.

Barb Higgins: The land separation has to be done first, other things will have to follow. We are not trying to stop this, we just need all the proper paperwork to be completed.
