

Alonso High School Game Day Operations FAQ:

We welcome you to the 2020 fall sports season and hope information contained in this document will help you enjoy your experience! The objective of limiting spectators and implementing these protocols is to provide the safest environment for our guests, athletes, and coaches and to do everything we can to preserve our season. While waiting in line for stadium entry, restrooms and/or concessions, please remember to socially distance yourselves. Protocols explained in this document will continuously be evaluated as the season progresses.

1. What time will the gate open to enter the stadium?

V Football 6:30pm. JV Football 6:00pm. JV/V Volleyball 5:45pm. V Volleyball 6:00pm

2. How do I enter the stadium/gym?

All tickets will be scanned next to the main ticket booth at the stadium and the door by the snack shack leading into the gym.

3. Will I have to show ID when I have my ticket scanned?

Yes, adults and high school age students will have to show ID in order to verify their name on the list.

4. What time will the parking lots be open?

Varsity Football 6:00pm, JV Football 5:30pm, Volleyball 5:30pm.

5. How much does it cost to park?

\$2 plus service fees. All parking fees will be cashless, you must have a credit/debit card to pay for parking.

6. Where to do I park?

All parking will be in the student lot. (Parking lot closes to Hillsborough Ave). Should there be a need for more parking – the lot closest to Waters Ave. will be opened. (This is the designated parking for visiting football teams.)

7. Who can come to a game?

Strict enforcement of HCPS's Return to Athletics Plan will be enforced for spectator attendance. Each visiting team's coaches (up to 20) and those dressed in the contest (up to 60) will be permitted to invite up to four guests per person. Only those who are

listed as a participant's four guests will be admitted into the gate with a ticket or booster pass. If you are not listed as a participant's four guests, you will not be permitted to enter the game; even if you have purchased a ticket.

8. Do band and cheerleaders get to come to the game?

HCPS's Return to Athletics Plan does not allow for visiting team band and cheerleaders to attend an away contest. If these individuals wish to attend, they must be listed as one of four of a coach or player's guests and they must sit in the stands.

9. How do I submit my school's guests list?

Student participants will fill out an excel spread sheet that will have to be turned in to Ms. Omensetter so that it is sent to the host school's Athletic Director. The visiting team's Athletic Director will be required to submit the guests list to the home school's Athletic Director no later than noon on game day.

10. Can I substitute a name at the gate?

Once the visiting school's administration has submitted their guests list to the home school, substitutions or changes to the list will not be allowed.

11. Does my baby brother/sister have to be listed as one of my four guests?

YES, all "bodies" (regardless of age) must be listed in order to gain entry into the stadium/gym. Children under 5 will NOT need a ticket purchased for them, but they MUST be listed as a participant's guest.

12. How do I purchase a ticket to the game?

All tickets must be purchased at <https://www.sdhc.k12.fl.us/departments/39/athletics/about/> and all tickets are electronic. Tickets cannot be purchased with cash. When searching for a contest, you must search by the home school for that contest.

13. If I have a booster pass/student activity card, or 10 game student pass, do I have to be included as one of the four guests a participant can invite?

Yes, even with a pass, you are still required to be listed as one of four guests a participant can invite.

14. Where do I sit?

Stadium/Gym seating has been designated with a blue rectangle to mark one pod of four people. All four guests of a game day participant are required to sit together in one pod. Smaller rectangles are for single seats. Visiting school spectators are required to sit on the visitor's side.

15. Can I watch the game from along fencing inside the stadium?

In order to reduce contact areas and touch spaces, law enforcement and administrators will enforce individuals from standing along any fence lines. All spectators are required to sit in the stands.

16. I am not listed as a participants four guests, how can I still watch the game?

All games will be live streamed through the NFHS Network. Click here to purchase a subscription <https://www.nfhsnetwork.com/>

17. Who can be on the sideline?

Only approved coaches with sideline passes and those athletes dressed in uniform are allowed on the sideline. No others are permitted on the sideline; home or visitors. Approved coaches (up to 20) are required to have the visiting school's sideline credentials worn at all times.

18. I am a member of the media, student/team photographer and/or college recruiter, where do I stand?

All individuals just described will be permitted in the "media zone" located in a roped off section of the end zone. You must have appropriate credentials to access this area and must stay social distances and within this zone.

19. Will the concession stand be open?

YES! Concessions will have a limited menu of prepackaged food (candy, chips, ice cream, drinks) and will be cashless. You must have a credit/debit card to pay for concessions.

20. Am I required to wear a mask?

Yes, everyone must wear a mask at all times when not eating or drinking.
