

Father Jerome's Message: The Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity (John 16:12-15)

Today, we celebrate the mystery and majesty of the Most Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—three distinct persons in perfect unity, bound by divine love and truth. In our Gospel reading, Jesus reassures His disciples that the Spirit will come, guiding them into the fullness of truth. Are we looking for ways to give generously, volunteer, or offer kindness to someone in need? Through acts of love, we reflect the triune nature of God.

Recognizing God in Daily Life - The Trinity is present in the beauty of creation, in the wisdom we receive, and in the love shared among believers. Do we take time to pause and recognize God's presence in the small moments—such as a peaceful morning, a meaningful conversation, or the strength we find in difficult times?

Living with Purpose - The Trinity reveals God's relational and mission-oriented nature. Are we discerning where Spirit is leading us? Whether in our careers, families, or ministries, seeking God's guidance and responding to His call strengthens our connection to Him and His divine plan.

By reflecting on these aspects, we can grow deeper in faith, embody God's love, and live in communion with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May the peace of the Father, the love of the Son, and the guidance of the Spirit be with you today and always.

The social hall will become an alternate space for future physical education classes. The glass on the framed DePadua pictures was not shatter resistant and posed a danger to students. The framed pictures were removed to provide a safe space for physical activity.

St. Agnes Cemetery Offers Monument Work

We have all seen headstones in a cemetery, slowly succumbing to time and neglect. The names become harder to read, the once vibrant stone turns dull, or

the stone becomes overgrown with sod, lichens and moss. Monuments and markers are silent stories etched in stone. They tell the world about a life lived. But weather and biological growth can wear away at the stone making the inscriptions fade.

The sexton of St. Agnes Cemetery, Travis Weber, is now providing services to professionally clean upright monuments and flat markers. Gentle and effective cleaning removes dirt, grime, and environmental buildup that can accelerate deterioration. Charges for the cleaning service are based on the size of the monument or marker, with a minimum fee of \$40 for the cleaning of one flat marker. For an additional fee, services are offered to level and raise flat markers. Leveling of upright monuments will not be provided due to the liability of damage to the headstone.
