


Jesus leads us to inherit eternal life. He says, "I am the way, and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6)

Question of the Week: What riches in your life can you sacrifice and give to those in need?



Religious education classes at Ss. Peter and Paul, Moquah, were treated to a special program on the Bible and the Bible lands on Sept. 25. David Hnath of St. Peter, Dauby, presented a slide show about the lands of the Bible, which he visited six times over the years--as a tourist, student (of the Hebrew University) and as an archaeologist working at dig sites at Bethsaida and the Western Wall in Jerusalem, along side noted archaeologists from Israel and the U.S. He also showed his vast collection of vintage Bibles and Bible pages like his 3-volume Catholic Douay-Rhemes English Bible, dating from 1582-1610, and a limited-edition copy of the 2-volume Gutenberg Bible (Latin), the first book to be printed by moveable type in 1466. He also showed and described his genuine Bible pages taken from the King James Bible (1611); the Tyndale Bible (1535), the first Catholic Bible printed in English; the Geneva Bible (1560), the first English Bible to use numbered verses; and the Martin Luther (German) New Testament (1522). He also showed the classes a hand-written Bible page done by monks in 1250 A.D. on vellum (animal skin). The students and adults in attendance enjoyed the presentation.



Mr. Roush and his 6th grade class had a wonderful opportunity to canoe to a floating bog in Moquah, WI. Students were able to bring some samples back to the classroom for further exploration and study.





Students walked to Kreher Park to meet some members of the Coast Guard from the United States Coast Guard Station Bayfield to learn about what life is like in the Coast Guard, lake and ice safety, and hear a few good stories. Students were able to tour one of their vessels and ask some great questions.

Northern Great Lakes Visitor

Center on September 20th. Rangers

Ariana, Juniper and Amanda
introduced the theme of Healthy
Habitats for our area. The students
investigated the pond, learned about
mammals near the pond, hiked and
went to the observation tower. Thank
