

Carpenter Center Camp and Covid-19

At this time, we expect to operate our summer day camp program as planned beginning June 1, 2020. The Carpenter Center's priority is always on the health and safety of your child. In addition to the many steps we take every day to protect the health of our guests, campers, and staff, we will work closely with the Panhandle Unified Command team to incorporate recommendations and guidance from local, state and national agencies and follow guidance for a healthy camp community for all.

Camp will look a little different this year due to Covid-19 recommendations. We are limiting enrollment to 12 campers for each camp session, for a total of 36 campers. There will be three 2-hour sessions per day, Monday through Thursday. Fridays will be field trip days. Each age group will have 2 local field trips during the course of camp. Camp staff will assign your child to a session, and notify you of your child's schedule the week of May 25th, 2020. This year's camp is centered around service to others (and encouraging intergenerational friendships), fun in the sun, and gardening/food sustainability. All positive ways to nourish our bodies, minds, and souls. There is no better place for kids to connect, make new friends, try new things, and discover their potential. We will continue to keep lines of communication open and transparent as summer approaches. One thing we know for sure: Kids will need camp more than ever.
