# Making a Safe Fireplace Fire

### 1. Check Your Fireplace and Chimney

- Open the damper to allow smoke to exit.

### 2. Prepare the Area

- Clear the hearth and surrounding area of flammable materials.
- Use a fireplace screen to prevent sparks from escaping.

### 3. Gather Materials

- **Firewood:** Use seasoned, dry hardwood. Avoid green or wet wood as it creates more smoke.
- Kindling: Small, dry sticks or twigs.
- **Fire Starters:** Use crumpled newspaper or commercial fire starters.
- Do not use lighter fluid or gasoline.

### 4. Build the Fire

- Arrange crumpled newspaper or fire starters in the center of the fireplace.
- Place kindling in a crisscross pattern over the newspaper.
- Stack larger logs on top, leaving enough space for air to circulate.

### 5. Light the Fire

- Light the newspaper or fire starters with a match or lighter.
- Let the kindling catch fire before adding more wood.

### 6. Tend the Fire

- Add logs as needed, placing them carefully to maintain airflow.
- Keep the fire small and manageable.

### 1 Monitor the Fire

- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Ensure children are kept at a safe distance.

### 2. Extinguish the Fire

- Allow the fire to burn down naturally.
- Spread the ashes evenly and let them cool.
- Use a shovel to place the ashes in a metal container with a lid **only once cooled down.**



# How to Lock & Unlock Patio Doors

While it's not that complicated, but surprisingly, we've found that many visitors struggle with locking and unlocking the Anderson Patio doors. To make things easier, here are simple instructions on how to use them:.

# Guide to Locking and Unlocking an Anderson Single French Door (with the handle you push up to lock)

### **Unlocking the Door:**

- 1. Stand in front of the door Make sure you're facing the door handle.
- 2. Find the handle It's a long lever that moves up and down.
- 3. Push the handle down Press the handle downward until you feel it release from the locked position.
- 4. Open the door After the handle is down, simply open the door like normal.

### **Locking the Door:**


- 1. Close the door Make sure the door is completely closed, and the edge is snug against the frame.
- 2. Locate the handle It's still the long lever on the door.
- 3. Lift the handle up Push the handle upward, toward the top of the door. You should feel resistance as it locks.
- 4. Make sure it's locked Give the door a gentle push or pull to ensure it's fully secured. If it doesn't move, it's locked.

### **Pro Tips:**

- If you struggle to lift or lower the handle, try gently pulling the door toward you to make sure it's completely closed.
- If the door doesn't lock or unlock, check for any debris or obstruction in the locking mechanism that could be preventing movement.

# TV Remotes

If you have trouble watching TV, use the LG remote to switch to HDMI1 by pressing the Source button. Once there, you can use the cable remote to browse channels. Alternatively, you can log into your personal Netflix or Amazon Prime accounts directly on the TV and stream content.




# Alarm Panel

### **To Disarm The Alarm**

One the door is open, you have 60 seconds to **enter** your code.

### To Set The Alarm

- 1. When ready to Arm Away (everyone out), make sure all windows and doors are closed. Send everyone outside and with the door shut, stand in front of alarm panel, standing still (to avoid motion detectors) until panel is Ready to Arm.
- 2. Enter your alarm code. You will hear the alarm beeping. You have 60 seconds to exit and lock the door.



# Laundry Room


### Washer:

- Load Clothes Do not overload; leave space for movement.
- Add Detergent Pod Place directly in the drum before adding clothes.
- Select Cycle Choose based on fabric type and soil level.
- Start Washer Close the lid/door and press start.
- Remove Clothes Promptly To prevent wrinkles and mildew.

### **Dryer:**

- Clean Lint Trap Before each use for safety and efficiency.
- Load Clothes Shake out items and do not overload.
- Add Fabric Softener Sheet Place one sheet on top of clothes.
- Select Cycle & Temperature Match fabric care instructions.
- Start Dryer Close the door and press start.
- Remove Clothes Promptly Fold or hang immediately to prevent wrinkles.

▲ **Note:** Detergent pods and fabric softener sheets are provided. Please use responsibly. Keep the laundry area clean and report any issues.



# Kitchen

- Appliances: The kitchen is equipped with a full-sized refrigerator,
   oven, stovetop, microwave, dishwasher, coffee maker, toaster, and kettle.
  - Only use non-abrasive glass cooktop cleaner provided (under sink) to clean stove top.
- **Cooking Essentials:** Pots, pans, utensils, and basic spices are available for your use.
- **Dishwasher**: Please use one detergent pod per cycle (provided under the sink).



• **Thermostat:** Adjust the temperature as needed, but please return to [55°F] upon departure.



- Trash Bags: Located under the kitchen sink.
- Trash Disposal Guidelines:

### **TRASH**

YES: ALUMINUM TAKE-OUT CONTAINERS, FLAT CARDBOARD (CEREAL BOXES, SIX-PACK HOLDERS, ETC.), EGG CARTONS, MILK CARTONS, FOOD SCRAPS
NO: GLASS, PLASTIC, METAL, PAPER, MAGAZINES, ALUMINUM CANS

### **CATSKILLS RECYCLE** - HOW TO SEPARATE

Please follow these recycling rules, things are done differently up here!

### **Three Recycle Groups**

- Cans, Bottles and Plastics: Bottles and jars must be emptied and rinsed out. Place recycling in clear garbage bag but do not tie bag tightly.
- Cardboard: Corrugated cardboard only! No flat cardboard like cereal boxes, etc.
- Paper: Office paper and newspaper. "Office Paper" means copy paper, envelopes, junk mail, etc

<sup>\*</sup>All trash must be placed in clear plastic bags—no black bags are allowed.
