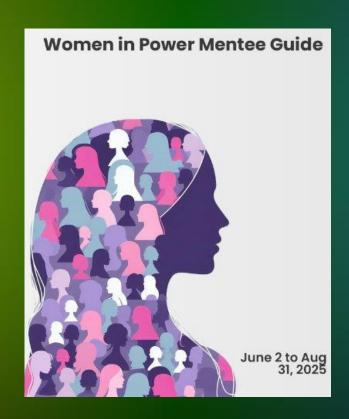


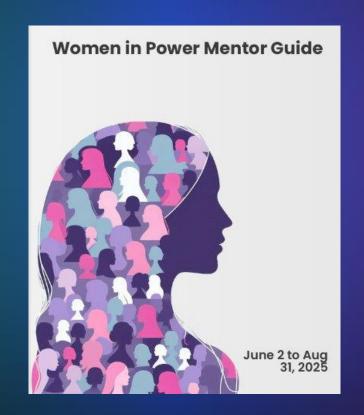

- Don't Overlook Feedback
- Don't Miss Meetings
- Don't Set Unrealistic Expectations

Do's

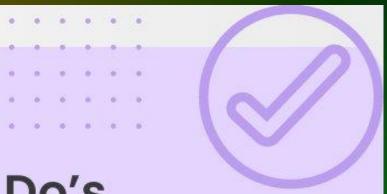
- ✓ Be Open-Minded
- ✓ Point your mentor in the right direction
- ✓ Stay Engaged
- ✓ Communicate Transparently
- ✓ Reflect and Apply











Do's

- Engage the mentee by listening and goal-setting
- Point your mentee in the right direction
- Celebrate with the mentee
- Be a teacher and a guide
- Show them the ropes

Being a Mentor



- Talk more than you listen (within reason)
- Discredit their goals and ambitions
- Provide vague or unactionable feedback
- Be overly positive
- Break trust

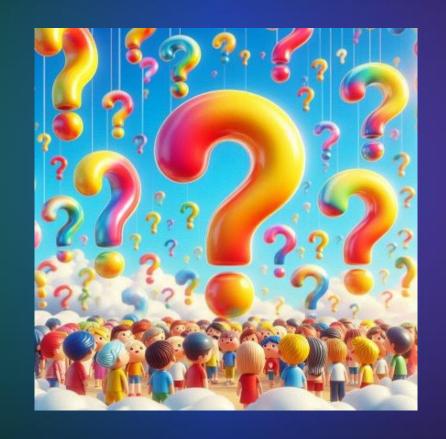
