WHAT IS HISTORICAL TRAUMA?

Historical Trauma is the accumulative emotional and psychological pain over an individual's lifespan and across generations, as the result of massive group trauma – such as racial discrimination, slavery genocide and ecocide. Historical trauma can have varied effects on individuals and populations, including depression, high mortality, alcohol abuse, child abuse and domestic violence. Historical trauma examples have been extensively researched among Lakota and other Native American populations, Holocaust survivors and descendants. The sites at Fort Wayne, Delray and Zug Island hold hundreds of years of historical trauma locked inside them – the extent of which is now being uncovered, in order for the healing and revitalization process to begin.
