Music is specialized because at every stage of that development of the sound delivered and communicated to humans there is another human-being creating and making decisions on that sound based on their undeniable personal individuality and intellectual comprehension which is unique and different to any other human on the planet whom is unique onto themselves. *With instrument performance, recording and live performance of music every musician is different.* Clearly this is why the Music Profession is a Specialized Profession.

Musicians and the professions of music as a creed.

We musicians are a creed because every comprehensive element, task and work we do is so that we may follow the *passion for live performance of music* to a audience of one or many. In form it is a religion, a belief and a faith. For it is a organic relationship /transmission to those that hear our song and find a relationship to the musical presentation for which that song can become a religion to their own human reality. *The passion for performance* is that common denominator that binds and establishes all musicians uniquely together as specialized workers.
