The History of National Coming Out Day

The LGBTQ community and its allies began celebrating National Coming Out Day more than 30 years ago, on the one-year mark of 1987's historical National March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights. Believing the personal is political, founding activists Robert Eichberg and Jean O'Leary sought to unite their community by positively raising awareness for LGBTQ civil rights as they celebrated authenticity.

"Most people think they don't know anyone gay or lesbian, and in fact, everybody does," Eichberg later reflected. "It is imperative that we come out and let people know who we are and disabuse them of their fears and stereotypes."

In 1988, the first National Coming Out Day was celebrated in 18 states, expanding nationwide to all 50 and even seven other countries by 1990. It was then that organizers partnered with the Human Rights Campaign, the nation's largest LGBTQ civil rights group, to reach more people than ever before.

"We first observed National Coming Out Day as a reminder that

one of our most basic tools is the power of coming out," they share ahead of each Oct. 11 celebration. "One out of every two Americans has someone close to them who is gay or lesbian. For transgender people, that number is only one in 10.

"Coming out – whether it is as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender or queer – STILL MATTERS," the organization continues. "When people know someone who is LGBTQ, they are far more likely to support equality under the law. Beyond that, our stories can be powerful to each other."

It's important to remember that everyone has the right to decide for themselves if, how and when they come out, which doesn't only happen once. It can be an ongoing process for many in the LGBTQ community, which National Coming Out Day fully recognizes and embraces.

Whatever your age, gender identity, national origin, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation and much more, there's a community waiting to welcome you.

Come OUT St. Pete celebrates you for who you are on this and every National Coming Out Day.

Come OUT St. Pete is celebrating our 4th year in the Grand Central District! The concept of the annual festival and parade was established as a desire to celebrate National Coming Out Day on October 11th.

This year's celebration on October 17th will be very scaled back and will maintain socially-distant protocols due to COVID-19! We have been working closely with the City of St. Petersburg, the mayor's office and the Grand Central District businesses in following all CDC and city guidelines, so we can provide an event that is socially-distanced.

Our top priority is for everyone attending this celebration in person to feel safe. Masks and hand sanitizer will be available at each vendor location. For those who choose to stay at home, we will be streaming much of the event LIVE on our Facebook page, so you still can attend from the safety and comfort of your home.

Our vendors will be placed in strategic locations up and down the Grand Central District between 17th and 31st Streets to provide enough space to maintain social distancing. Our Come Out As You Are Royal Court will be performing and

conducting LIVE interviews throughout the day.

We made the decision not to hold the annual parade and instead chose to partner with the West Flamingo Car Club and the League of Jeepers in hosting a car cruise up Central Avenue. It begins at 11 a.m. on October 17th. Decorate your car, jeep or motorcycle and come join us.

While many of our other weeklong activities are cancelled this year, we were pleased to offer a new in-person event for 2020.

Come OUT St. Pete, in partnership with Eight O'Clock Theatre, scheduled a weekend of performances of Terrance McNally's "Mothers and Sons" October 9th-11th at the Central

Park Performing Arts Theater in Largo. Protocols were in place to ensure the safety of guests and performers at this event.

We also had an unfurling of our city block-long rainbow flag within Seminole Park in Historic Kenwood on Saturday, October 11th. For a list of all of our events, utilize this guide and visit ComeOUTStPete.org/Events.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rick Kriseman, Mayor of the City of St. Petersburg, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 17, 2020 as

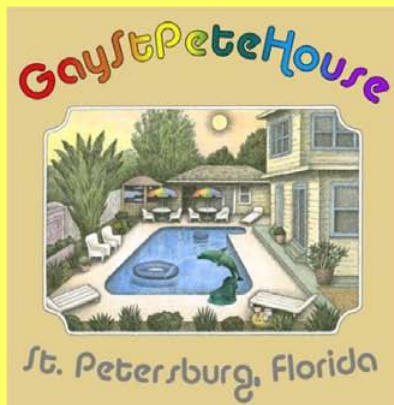



Community Outreach

Come OUT St. Pete advocates for all

Come OUT St. Pete (COSP) has advocated for the acceptance of every sexual orientation and gender identity since 2017, encouraging a sense of community by promoting equality for all.

While 2020 has been a year unlike any other – as communities like ours unite against bigotry across the country and face a pandemic threatening the globe – that mission is unchanged. In fact, this year has only strengthened it.

After worldwide protests against police brutality began in May, COSP partnered with the Dr. Carter G. Woodson African American Museum to stand against racism. Its board, along with fellow advocacy organization Project No Labels, safely gathered to hold a vigil June 27. “Together We Rise” sought to unite the LGBTQ and Black communities in St. Petersburg.

“We must recognize the origin of Pride was a riot against police actions,” COSP shared at the time, “and show solidarity when any minority is facing persecution.”

More than 100 volunteers came together, maintaining social distance to unfurl COSP’s 375-foot rainbow flag. They knelt for nearly nine minutes of silence to reflect on the Black Lives Matter movement and Pride Month.

The museum’s executive director Terri Lipsey Scott reflected on the virtually-streamed vigil afterwards, calling it a “beautiful and moving tribute to Black

Lives Matter while commemorating PRIDE in our community.”

St. Petersburg’s commitment to inclusivity continued in the next month. LGBTQ advocates worked together to raise more than \$7,000 to install a Progressive Pride street mural in the Grand Central District, seen above, which COSP’s board voted unanimously to help fund.

The LGBTQ community’s creativity took center stage in August as well, when COSP and Woodfield Fine Art presented its annual art contest and exhibit. Designed to promote Tampa Bay artists and celebrate National Coming Out Day, more than 150 adult and youth submissions were received.

This year’s grand-prize winner was “Peek.A.Boo,” painted by St. Petersburg artist Nelson Perez. The piece can be seen on promotional materials for COSP’s fourth year, including the cover of this year’s guide.

More than 60 other COSP finalists remain on display in an ongoing virtual exhibit, including the youth category’s winner

COSP’s pageantry also moved to a virtual format this year with the inaugural Come Out As You Are drag contest. Held Aug. 13–Sept. 7, Tampa Bay contestants who perform as drag queens, drag kings and those who identify as either transgender or nonbinary entered to represent COSP in its fourth year.

Ensuring COSP’s pageantry was more inclusive was a natural fit. “There is so much going on in the world where we are learning how to include and embrace each other,” the board reflected at the time. “We need to do that within our own community as well.”

Video entries were submitted for consideration that included visual representations of Pride and various talents. Three

winners were unveiled in a socially-distant ceremony streamed live from Enigma in St. Petersburg on Sept. 7.

COSP crowned drag queen and transgender entertainer Stephanie Stuart, nonbinary entertainer Kristina White and drag king Joanie Werner to represent the organization this year. Learn more about them by watching each representative’s entry at ComeOutStPete.org/Contest and during live streamed events at this year’s celebration.

From partnering with Equality Florida to contact pro-LGBTQ voters ahead of this year’s general election to unfurling their rainbow flag in St. Petersburg’s Historic Kenwood for National Coming Out Day 2020, COSP’s community outreach continues.
