About GIL: The Global Institute of Lansing (GIL) is a non-profit organization that provides adult refugees and immigrants settled in the Lansing area educational assistance and the means to attain a high school diploma in an atmosphere of peace, respect, encouragement, and inspiration.

Job Summary: To provide math support to adult English Language Learners in a positive learning environment while they work towards earning a high school diploma.

Responsibilities:

- Manage classroom and assist students working on various math classes
- Provide in-person one-on-one and small/large group math instruction to supplement math classes
- Will help develop and teach a class for prospective students focusing on basic math skills
- Occasionally work remotely with students over Zoom or Google Classroom
- Monitor progress of students and review their progress with them
- Keep up-to-date on curriculum used by the online school and how it impacts GIL's students
- Help maintain records used for grant reporting
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree or higher required (degree must be in a math-related field if applicant does not have a teaching certificate)
- Teaching certificate preferred (secondary with math endorsement)
- Prior classroom teaching experience required
- Bilingual/Multilingual preferred
- Must be flexible and able to adapt to different students working on a variety of classes at once
- Strong organizational and communication skills
- Ability to work with students from diverse backgrounds
- Ability to work collegially and collaboratively with other volunteer teachers and staff
- Strong technology background with the ability to integrate technology into the classroom
- Satisfactory completion of background checks
