Common Signs of Opioid Overdose

Behavioral Changes

Physical Symptoms

Sudden changes in behavior, such as increased secrecy, withdrawal from social activities, or a drop in academic performance, can be red flags.

Noticeable weight loss, frequent drowsiness, and poor hygiene can indicate opioid misuse. Other signs include constricted pupils, slurred speech, and coordination issues.

Emotional Indicators

Mood swings, increased irritability, and unexplained anxiety or depression are common emotional signs of opioid abuse.



Case Study: Success in a Vulnerable Minority District
