By not trying, you are a failure to yourself. If a thing looks to tough, and you just give up on it without fighting, without trying, you most certainly are a failure. Maybe not a failure in actual process - this you will never know, because you didn't try - but you are a failure in the fact that you didn't even try - you didn't use your God-given gifts of brains and muscles, either/or, to at least try.

That is the story - try. Look how often we have used this little word in the above paragraph. And you can never overuse it because it is common and necessary in almost everything that we do in life. You will never know what the future might hold for you, unless you are man enough to give things a whirl. Step up and fight when the odds seem mighty, and then if you go down to defeat - you might have failed to accomplish what you set out to do - but you aren't a failure! The difference is that you tried. You used your brains, you used your muscles, and you did everything in your power to succeed. Knowing this about yourself, you cannot be considered a Failure.

Maybe you feel you just weren't cut out to be an athlete. That leads us to a couple of thoughts. One, if you like sports and want to play, don't let this fear stop you. Don't let this possible embarrassment hold you back. Instead, go out and give it everything you have, and if you find you just don't stack up - then it is time to stop and think. Don't give up on it, but rather, work hard to learn more. In most cases, by practising and working hard, you will become better in the sport and in many times, actually become outstanding. In some cases, however, you may just not be equipped to handle a certain sport on a level with others, no matter how hard you practise. Once again, don't give up on it - but keep your interest and develop it in other ways with that sport. Play at a lower level and substitute at that level. There will always be a place for you in sport, if you want it, no matter how good you are, or how bad you are! But you must try!

Number two, if you feel you weren't cut out to be an athlete, and have no interest in sport, don't be pushed into it. There are many other hobbies and interests to occupy your mind and actions. But, make very, very sure that you have no interest in sports. Make sure it isn't a lack of confidence, not a lack of interest that holds you back.

We will find many more boys in group one rather than group two. Don't place yourself in group two because of this fear of embarrassment. You cannot be considered a failure, if you will only try. You cannot fail if you have the guts to try! Who says you can't! Did you ever try?
