That is the story - try. Look how often we have used this little word in the above paragraph. And you can never overuse it because it is common and necessary in almost everything that we do in life. You will never know what the future might hold for you, unless you are man enough to give things a whirl. Step up and fight when the odds seem mighty, and then if you go down to defeat - you might have failed to accomplish what you set out to do - but you aren't a failure! The difference is that you tried. You used your brains, you used your muscles, and you did everything in your power to succeed. Knowing this about yourself, you cannot be considered a Failure.

Maybe you feel you just weren't cut out to be an athlete. That leads us to a couple of thoughts. One, if you like sports and want to play, don't let this fear stop you. In some cases, however, you may just not be equipped to handle a certain sport on a level with others, no matter how hard you practise. We will find many more boys in group one rather than group two. Don't place yourself in group two because of this fear of embarrassment. You cannot be considered a failure, if you will only try. You cannot fail if you have the guts to try! Who says you can't? Did you ever try?
