This is so important because what purpose to life, if one cannot enjoy it. To enjoy it comes in many different forms, to each his own - but definitely find your own formula and make full use of it. The only restriction on this - don't infringe upon others while doing this - having fun.

The learning should be fun and the benefit of discovery, of accomplishment increases this fun. By learning to do certain things by onself, that thrill is compounded. Through exposure, through being given the opportunity to learn, in this atmosphere of harmony, the desire should grow, and with it, the learning.

In ending this second thought however, one very important aspect of "doing it yourself" - the desire yes, but never forget, everyone needs a helping hand from someone, at some time. Be ready to extend yours, and to take that which is offered. There is no shame in either.
