THE BOBCATS will be starting out in defense of a title they have won three years in a row. Over this span, they have won 32 games without defeat, including WSLFC titles in the Pee-wee Division (1961 and 1965) and the Midgets (1966). They have never lost a game and in 1966, allowed only 13 points; all coming in the last quarter, in league play.
