EXPERIENCE

Experience is a great teacher. It might be that first realization a stove can get hot, that ice is slick, to bite your tongue in certain situations, or it might be the efficiency you gain when you repeat a task.

Old cars are an experience. Experience was gained from leaving it sit too long and the brakes needing an overhaul, from that bodywork that looked pretty good until the paint went on, when that left rear brake locks up far from home, or that annoying electrical gremlin that a certain tap might bring back to life. Every time we do something with our old cars, we gain experience.

Imagine the amazing collective experience we have in the Mid Mo Old Car Club? We tap in to it every time we get together. We ask questions like, “has anyone done this to their car?”, “Does anyone have a certain tool I can borrow?”, or “Remember when that model of car came out and always overheated?” I look forward to those discussions and I am impressed when Wes Scott pulls out a homemade head puller, Ron Bogg laughs and explains how to separate a head with gunpowder, Jack Boswell describes what commonly goes wrong with a tube radio, or when Dennis Smith details how to key a door handle lock. Times have changed and the internet has helped document experience. I watch many YouTube videos when tackling a project for the first time. Unfortunately, I can never ask the YouTube presenter a question or seek a different angle or perspective, but live Tech Sessions allow us to do that.

At the April 26 meeting (6pm, Cole County Sheriff’s Classroom at 350 East High Street JCMO), we get to learn from Experience. We have two presentations that night:

- The first presenter is John Robinson. John is an author and friend of mine. Among many titles, I met him when he was Chief of Staff to Lt. Governor Roger Wilson and, later, he became the Director of the Missouri Division of Tourism. John has driven his Pontiac Sunfire on every road on the State of Missouri Official Highway Map. Along those routes, he saw a variety of things, heard lots of stories, and made his own experiences. Come listen John as he tells some stories from his book, “A Road Trip into America’s Hidden Heart”.
- The second presenter is our first Tech Session of 2018 as MMOCC’s own Bob Peitzmeyer demonstrates **Cutting, Buffing, Polishing, and Waxing**. We will have donor car body parts for demonstration as to the right way and wrong way to touch your car. If you have a preferred product, bring it along to demonstrate. Unlike YouTube, you can get up close and personal, ask questions, and even practice!

We had a great experience on March 24 when 23 members and 6 old cars went to Eldon, toured Stark Caverns, visited Poppy’s Antique shop, and lunched at the Silver Dollar. Our flexible group had a good time and I was home in time for my Saturday afternoon nap.

Experiences excite kids, so let them experience your old car at a tour, a cruise night at Capital Mall (first one of the summer is April 28), or just go for a ride around the block. The excitement we build in kids today will keep our hobby, and love for cars, alive well in to the future.

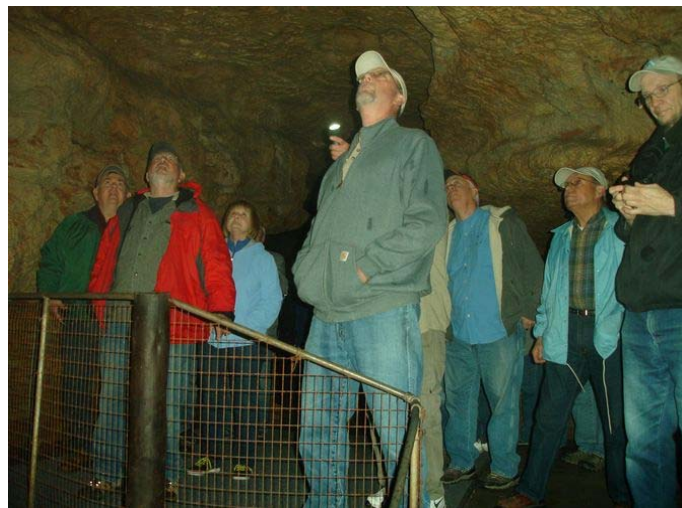

MMOCC Bylaws (last amended- 27 April 1995):

Article I - Name: Mid Mo Old Car Club

Article II - Purpose: The purpose of this club is to unite antique and special interest car owners and enthusiasts who are interested in restoring and maintaining their car in a manner to attract prestige and respect within the community. To serve as a medium of exchange of ideas, information, and parts for admirers of antique, classic and special interest autos. To aid them in their efforts to restore, preserve and exhibit the car in its original likeness and to help keep automotive history alive. The club shall be non-commercial, non-partisan, and non-sectarian.

Article III - Members: Requirements for membership shall not insist upon the actual possession of an antique car, but merely an interest in the cars and a desire to take part in club activities .
