Ride a Duck?

One of the most original vehicles in military history, the DUKW, known as "the Duck," was produced as a solution to a specific problem encountered early in WWII. Time and again, American supply vessels found themselves standing offshore unable to deliver vital supplies. Two men, Palmer Putham and Ron Stephens, envisioned an amphibious vehicle capable of ferrying men and cargo from ship to beach. DUKW stands for:

- D: A vehicle designed in 1942
- U: "Utility" (amphibious)
- K: All-wheel drive
- W: Two powered rear axles

Built by the GMC division of General Motors and powered by a GMC OHV inline six-cylinder engine with 270 cubic inches, the DUKW weighs in at 7.5 tons, operates at a top speed of 6.4 mph on water and 50 mph on land. They measured 31 feet long and 8.2 feet wide. GM plants in Pontiac, Michigan and St. Louis, Missouri produced 21,000 vehicles between 1943-1945. Thousands are still in use worldwide. Most parts can still be purchased from GM.



As a basis for their design they used the proven GM 2-1/2 ton truck. A waterproof hull substituted the standard body and a propeller and rudder were added for use in the water. Amazingly, 85% of DUKW parts were common with the original GM truck. Just 38 days after the completion of the mock up, the first Duck rolled out of the workshop. From the onset the project met with skepticism from the military, however, Lady Luck stepped in four days prior to the demonstration. A Coast Guard vessel ran aground in heavy seas. When all other attempts to rescue the stranded crew failed, the Coast Guard requested help and two Ducks were sent. Despite the waves, the pair successfully retrieved the entire crew. Shortly afterwards the original vessel broke up.

Over the next few days, the story of the dramatic rescue was publi-



cized and subsequent demonstrations were well attended. The Army Duck was finally on its way to becoming a huge success. Over two thousand Ducks were utilized on D-Day. Not only did America have DUKWs, 2,000 were supplied to Britain under FDR's Lend/Lease program. An additional 535 were used by Australian forces, while 568 were supplied to the Soviet Union.


After the war many of the Ducks were sold, although the Army deployed several hundred during the Korean Conflict. France deployed theirs to the Indo China War. They were given new hulls in the 1970s and subsequently retired in 1982. The Royal Marines still use them for training purposes. In Australia, they are sill in use, not only for tours but were also used on Antarctic supply voyages until 1970. From 1945-1965 they supplied lighthouses on remote islands. Several were used by fishermen to take their fresh catch right off the boat to market in California.

Whenever a natural disaster happens, it's Ducks to the rescue, saving hundreds of lives in the 1955 Hunter Valley floods. They were loaned out in the Great Flood of 1993 and in 2005, deployed to help in the aftermath of hurricane Katrina, transporting 67 victims from their roof tops to helicopter pads temporarily set up in New Orleans.

In the early 1970s, Ford Motor Company was producing the Maverick, a compact car marketed as an affordable and efficient vehicle. However, the demand for the Maverick was not as high as Ford had anticipated, and they found themselves with a surplus of unsold cars.


To deal with this surplus, Ford decided to store thousands of unsold Mavericks in the Subtropolis caves located in Kansas City, Missouri. Subtropolis is a man-made underground complex of limestone mines, covering over 55 million square feet, and is home to many businesses that use the caves for storage and other purposes.


Ford leased about 25 acres of the cave complex, which was ideal for storing the cars as the caves are naturally climate-controlled with temperatures ranging between 60-70 degrees Fahrenheit year-round. The cars were kept in the caves until they could be sold, which reportedly took several years.

The storage of the Mavericks in the Subtropolis caves became somewhat of a legend in the automotive world, with many car enthusiasts and historians fascinated by the idea of thousands of unsold cars sitting underground for years. Today, the Subtropolis complex is still in use, and while the Mavericks are no longer stored there, the story of their time underground remains a unique piece of automotive history.


