WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Memorial Name:REX WHITTON EXPRESSWAY (Ironically, the Expressway has Five Stoplights)Year Established:August 16, 1961Travelway:US 50 from .057 mile(s) after DIX RD S to .057 mile(s) after CLARK AVE E

Rex M. Whitton, of Jackson County, Missouri, was the Chief Engineer of the Missouri State Highway Department and Federal Highway Administrator under presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson. Rex M. Whitton was born on August 7, 1898, in Jackson County, Missouri. He graduated from the University of Missouri in 1920 with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering. He began his forty year career with the Missouri State Highway Department May 1, 1920, as a member of a survey party. Whitton held various positions with the department until his appointment as Chief Engineer on July 23, 1951. Whitton was nominated by President Kennedy to the post of Federal Highway Administrator of the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Public Roads, in 1961, and he served in this capacity until 1966. During those years he was responsible for major highway activities. Principal among these were the programs of federal highway aid to the states which provided for the construction of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways and for the improvement of the main highways, secondary roads, and urban arterials included in the federal-aid road systems. Rex M. Whitton died on July 7, 1981.

The Honorable C. Forrest ``Red'' Whaley of Jefferson City, Missouri. He was the former mayor of Jefferson City. Red Whaley was born August 19, 1909, in Callaway County, Missouri. He

was a life long resident of Central Missouri and a graduate of Fulton High School and Westminster College. A registered pharmacist for over 66 years, Mr. Whaley moved to Jefferson City in 1933 where he worked at Tanner Drug Store for ten years. In 1943, he purchased East End Drug Store, and he later opened Whaley's Medical Center Pharmacy in 1974. Mr. Whaley served as mayor of Jefferson City, Missouri, from 1959 until 1963. He was a member of the Jefferson City Park Board, and he was very active on several civic committees, including efforts to ensure passage of important school bond and industrial bond issues. Mr. Whaley was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, where he served as an elder and a deacon. He was a past president of the Jefferson City Lions Club and the 1995 president of the Jefferson City Area Chamber of Commerce. He was a member of the original board of directors at Jefferson Bank.

Memorial Name: HSPD SGT BRYAN HOLOHAN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY

Sgt. Bryan Holohan served with the Holts Summit Police Department from January 2002 until declining health forced him to step down in July 2007. He continued to serve as police clerk until late 2009 and passed away the following year at age 36. Holts Summit Police Chief Kyle McIntyre said Holohan was very thorough as a sergeant, normally reading reports three times before he submitted them. He said Holohan was dedicated to helping out the community, even kissing a pig on the roof of the Bee Line snack shop after Holts Summit police raised \$1,000 for Special Olympics.

Memorial Name: TROOPER DENNIS H. MARRIOTT MEMORIAL HIGHWAY

Trooper Dennis H. Marriott died June 13, 1981, from injuries suffered on June 1, 1981, when he was struck by a vehicle. He had exited his patrol car for a traffic stop. The traffic crash occurred on U.S. Highway 54 south in Jefferson City, Missouri, in Cole County. Tpr. Marriott died from his injuries at the University Hospital almost two weeks after the incident. The vehicle that hit Tpr. Marriott stopped momentarily after the incident and then left the scene. The vehicle was stopped a few minutes later by the Jefferson City Police Department and the female driver, Mary Ann Holzer, was found to be intoxicated and was arrested. The driver later pled guilty and was sentenced to 10 years in prison on a charge of manslaughter. Trooper Dennis H. Marriott, 36, was the 11th uniformed member of this agency to lose his life in the line of duty. He was survived by his wife and four children.




