Auburn Automobile Company

Established in 1903 by Frank and Morris Eckhart, with the patronage of their father Charles Eckhart, the Auburn Automobile Company (AAC) produced some of the most-desirable, aesthetically striking and technologically innovative automobiles.

From its humble beginnings in the corner of the Eckhart Carriage Company factory, Frank and Morris grew the AAC to occupy its own dedicated facility in 1909. Headquartered in Auburn, Indiana, a town of 5,000 people, the company successfully built a reputable automobile that sold nationwide.

In 1924, Errett Lobban Cord became general manager and would save the AAC from an early death. Hired by a group of investors from Chicago who bought the AAC from the Eckhart family in 1919, Cord grew the reputation of Auburn automobiles worldwide. The consummate marketer, Cord knew how to promote racing prowess and invogue style, making these attributes synonymous with Auburn to this very day.

Engineers such as James Crawford, Herbert Snow, George Kublin and

Cornelius Van Ranst pushed the limits of technical innovation. Alan Leamy and Gordon Buehrig's magnificent body designs earned Auburns accolades for style worldwide.

The journey ended in 1937 with AAC's bankruptcy. E. L. Cord sold the company to AVCO and then headed out west to create new fortunes. Like a dying star, AAC burned the brightest just before its death, with their automobiles earning many speed and endurance records. Even today, Auburns are still revered for their elegance and performance.





The Origin of the Royal Arms of England – a European Connection



Juanita Fuller asked about the Ford Crest
Logo and its featured Lions during the New
Year's Day Garage Tour while visiting Tom
Winter's garage. Tom found the following....

The resulting 1949 model was the most redesigned Ford since the Model A. Freed from the constraints imposed by Henry, the engineers added independent front suspension and Hotchkiss drive with parallel leaf springs at the rear. Designer George Walker bid adieu the traditional separate-fender look both front and rear with a sleek new flat-sided pontoon body in the style of the 1947 Kaiser-Frazer.

Apparently, Ford executives convinced themselves that the classic Ford script wasn't suited to this futuristic machine and the famous icon was sent packing. The 1949 Fords bore no logo whatsoever. Subsequently, someone in marketing or advertising decided that the lack of a logo was a not such a good idea.

As a result, the 1950 Ford debuted with a new red, white and blue heraldic crest that according to the company was "derived by Ford stylists from an authentic coat of arms which dates back to 18th century England."

The new badge was indeed filled with traditional heraldic imagery.

The shield was divided into three coloured sections by a chromeedged black chevron that contained five chrome bezants. Each section
depicted a chrome passant lion.
