HISTORY (and old cars) ALL AROUND US

Around 6:30 on the evening of September 22, 1954, two inmates feigned illness to attract the attention of two guards. When the guards entered the hall to investigate, they were overpowered and their keys were stolen. The two inmates then bolted out of their cell and ran along the cell block, releasing others as they went, and a riot broke out. When the authorities regained control, four inmates were dead, as many as fifty were injured and one had attempted suicide. Four officers had been injured. No prisoners had escaped.




