1926 ~ AUTO WASH BOWL

Chicago, Cook County, Illinois

The Auto Wash Bowl, Southeast corner of Elston and Diversey, Chicago, IL. 1926

The nearly 80-foot-wide, ridged concrete bowl was about 16 inches at its deepest point in the center. Customers paid 25¢ to an attendant who strapped a protective rubber cover over the radiator. Patrons would then enter the bowl via a ramp and drive their cars around and around the bowl at a speed of about 10 miles per hour. The ridges in the concrete would vibrate the car and the water, creating a sloshing action that helped wash away all the mud from the chassis and wheels. The process took about three or four minutes. The car would then exit the bowl where patrons who wanted a complete car wash could enter one of the bays where the rest of the car would be cleaned. On a busy Saturday, about 75 cars per hour would go for a spin in the Auto Wash Bowl.

Looking Back - Paving the way to the future



This is a 1919 paving crew in the northeast Iowa town of Cresco. My grandfather Christian Haugen (1886-1958) is standing closest to the horse's neck.

The paving company was Fred Carlson of Decorah, Iowa. They were in business for over 100 years. The town of Cresco awarded this contract on 30 April 1919 and the work was to start two to three weeks after that. The price was \$2.32 per square yard and 32 cents per square foot for the curbing, which is 44 cents per linear foot.

The machine is a Koehring Machine Company paver. The company was founded in 1907 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and is credited with developing the first dry batch concrete paver. In 1921 it produced the first cable excavator. The company went on to produce a wide range of wheel and ladder trenchers.

Note: It appears they were using twenty-foot sections of steel well pipe to screed the concrete.
