


his undergraduate degree, and the University of Missouri at Columbia for graduate school.

NEWPORT HILL CLIMB

The Newport Indiana hill climb is a must do event if you want to enjoy old cars and the chance to see some of them attack the hill, one at a time, a timed climb. They close the town to spectator traffic, so you park on the west side of town and walked downtown or paid for a golf cart ride down town. It was maybe 7 blocks. On Sunday, they have a car show and the finals for the hill climb. As you walk down town, you pass the car show, some flea market booths, a area of hit and miss engines, and many food vendors. When you get to the town square, the west side has the start of the hill climb. At mid block, they have the starting line and the climb is level for 2 blocks, then a significant grade for an additional 3 blocks I think. The event features prewar cars, trucks and motorcycles. It allows orphan cars through 1955. In years past, I saw a Stanley Steamer climb the hill. This year cars of note included a 1931 Cord, a 1932 Auburn, a 1908? Brush, model T's, Model A's, old Harley Davidsons, a 1931 Norton, a few Donald Weber era Indians, and an old Harley with a side car and a passenger. The record holder was a 39 or 40 Ford and he climbed the hill in 23.7 seconds. The single cylinder Brush took two and a half minutes. They have a modified class for model T's. The Lions Club raffles a car each year. This year it was a 1955 DeSoto stick. Between runs, they open the cross street to allow people go to the main flea market and additional food vendors.







Beck's Service Station Mystery Woman Photo Identified

MMOCC member Wes Scott has in his possession a photograph received from MMOCC member Ron Bandelier, who in turn received it from Paul "Bob" Beck (Junior). The identity of the woman, sitting in a Beck's Service Station car, was unknown as Bob Beck had passed away in 2005. With the help of

Gary Schumtzler (historian) of Jefferson City, who contacted a Beck relative, the woman has now been identified.





The woman is: Priscilla Elisabeth Hilda (Rockelman) Beck (1904 – 1991). She was the wife of the service station owner: Paul Ernest or Ernst Beck (1903 – 1971). They were married in 1927. Both Paul Sr. and his son: Paul Robert "Bob" Beck (1929 – 2005) ran the service station for many years in Jefferson City. Paul Sr. was born in the Honey Creek community.

It appears Paul Beck purchased the DX station, located at Dunklin and Highway 50 West (now Missouri Boulevard) in May 1935. Prior to that it was one of two stations belonging to Carmain's Auto Service. DX gasoline and lubricants, at the time, were distributed by Mid-Continent Petroleum Company.

The 1940 U.S. Census indicates Paul as a manager/owner, Priscilla as an assistant in her husband's business and the 1950 Census indicates son Bob as a helper. Paul's 1942 WWII Draft Registration Card indicates his home address as: 215 Boonville Road, Employer: Capital City Oil Company at 200 East High Street and his business location as: 610 Harrison Street (now either MoDOT, the State Archives or a parking lot).

Bob Beck was a historian, writing a couple of articles in the 1970s for the Jefferson City newspaper about such things as local cemeteries, headstone designs and Indian history. A 1973 article describes Bob as "an avid student of local history and geography". It was at the Wilkerson Cemetery (slave and African-American) south of Saint Martins where Ron and Bob met each other. All three of the Becks are buried at Riverview Cemetery in Jefferson City.
