

Lake of the Ozarks and Bagnell Dam is a great day trip from Route 66 in Lebanon, Missouri about 40 miles north. 94 years ago on April 21, 1930, the first concrete was poured at the huge Union Electric dam at Bagnell,

Missouri. The boomtown of Damsite, shown here, had sprung up near the construction site. A little over a year later, Bagnell Dam was completed and the Lake of the Ozarks began forming behind it. The town of Damsite is gone now with the town of Lake Ozark next to Bagnell Dam.

Lake of the Ozarks is a reservoir created by impounding the Osage River in the northern part of the Ozarks in central Missouri. Parts of three smaller tributaries to the Osage are included in the impoundment: the Niangua River,



Grandglaize Creek, and Gravois Creek. Construction on the dam started in 1929 and was completed in 1931. The resulting reservoir, the Lake of the Ozarks, has a surface area of 55,000 acres, over 1,150 miles of shoreline, and stretches 94 miles from end to end. At the time of construction, it was the largest man-made lake in the United States and one of the largest in the world. Its construction virtually ended commercial traffic on the upper river.

U.S. Route 50, often referred to as the "Loneliest Road in America," is a major east-west highway that stretches across the United States. It runs for over 3,000 miles, from Ocean City, Maryland, on the Atlantic coast to Sacramento, California. The route passes through diverse landscapes, including the Appalachian Mountains, the Great Plains, the Rocky Mountains, and the deserts of the American West.

In Nevada, the stretch between Ely and Fallon is famously desolate, earning the "Loneliest Road" nickname. Despite its reputation, this section offers striking natural beauty and a sense of solitude. Along the route, travelers encounter a mix of small towns, historic sites, and scenic byways. Significant landmarks include the Sierra Nevada, Great Basin National Park, the Rocky Mountains, and the Missouri River. U.S. Route 50 also passes through several state capitals, including Annapolis, Maryland, Jefferson City, Missouri, and Carson City, Nevada.

Historically, the route traces parts of older trails, including the Pony Express and Lincoln Highway. It has played a crucial role in American transportation, linking remote regions and serving as a vital corridor for commerce and travel. Today, U.S. Route 50 remains an iconic and scenic drive, offering a unique




