**NOTE:** MMOCC Members are allowed to bring and display their vehicle, but it will NOT be judged or receive an award.

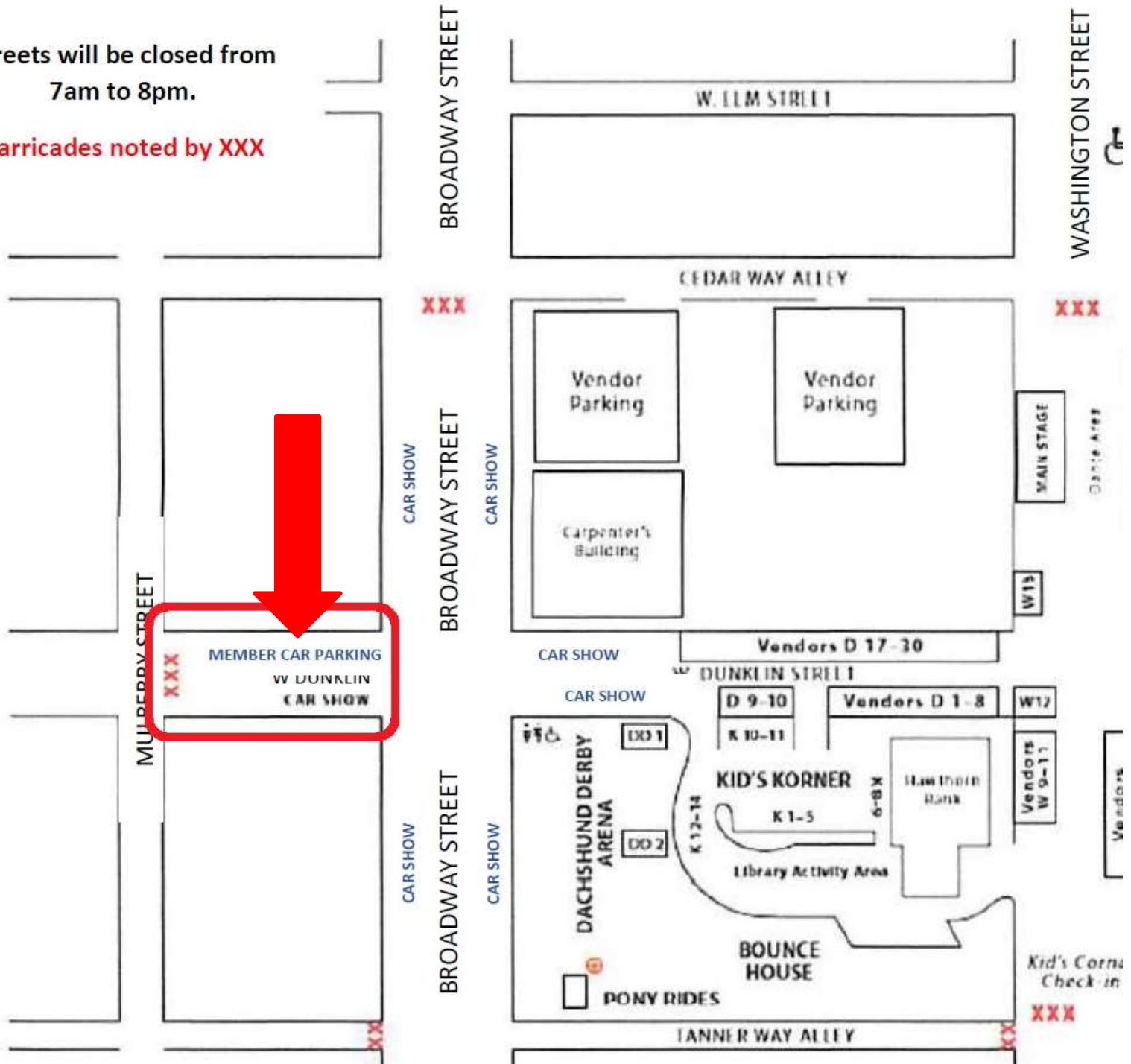

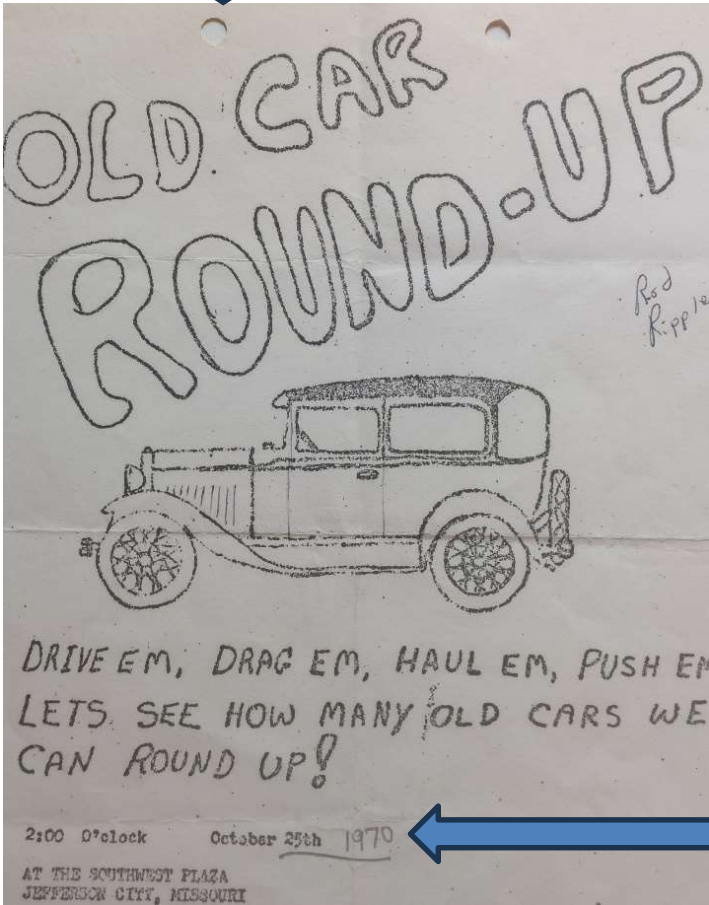

<b>A</b>	<b>PAINT and CAR FINISH (10 points)</b> Consider: Gloss, fading, surface prep, peeling, chips, rust, and poor striping.		.
<b>B</b>	<b>BODY WORKMANSHIP (10 points)</b> Consider: Roughness and signs of straightening or welding (fender beads or vinyl tops).		.
<b>C</b>	<b>WHEELS and TIRES (10 points)</b> Consider: Wheels: Condition of paint or chrome, spokes, and rims. Tires: Clean and (excessive) wear.		.
<b>D</b>	<b>SPRING, AXLES, FRAME, and UNDER-CARRIAGE (10 points)</b> Consider: Rust or oil, signs of makeshift repairs, and overall appearance.		.
<b>E</b>	<b>TOP or ROOF (10 points)</b> Consider: Headliner: Material, looseness, lopsided bows, tears and fading. Convertible tops: Interior and exterior condition, rear window. (Use best judgement if top is down.)		.
<b>F</b>	<b>UPHOLSTERY and INTERIOR (10 points)</b> Consider: Seats, seat backs, floor covering, side panels, dash instruments, steering wheel, floor pedals, and inside locks and handles.		.
<b>G</b>	<b>LAMPS and BRIGHT WORK (10 points)</b> Consider: Chrome: Plating condition, pits, and rust. Lamps: Glass chips, plastic faded, cracked. Manufacturers or any exterior factory emblems worn off.		.
<b>H</b>	<b>ENGINE and RADIATOR (10 points)</b> Consider: Engine: Paint, excessive oil leaks. Firewall and Side Panels: Paint, rust, oil, or grease. Radiator: Leaks or damage.		.
<b>I</b>	<b>WIRES, FUEL LINES, HOSES, BELTS, and ACCESSORIES (10 pts)</b> Consider: Worn, frayed or disorderly wiring, frayed belts, fuel lines hoses, or any makeshift repairs.		.
<b>J</b>	<b>OVERALL AUTHENTICITY. NOT JUDGED IN MODIFIED CLASS (10 pts)</b> Consider: Original equipment or dealership installed factory items. NOS or After-market original replacement parts are acceptable. Any factory markings or special items may be brought to our attention. It will be up to the owner to prove authenticity of any questionable item. Documentary evidence: (Catalogs, advertisement, ALAM Handbook, etc.)		.
<b>STOCK AND OPEN CLASSES – Possible Points 100</b>			.
<b>MODIFIED CLASSES – Possible Points 90 (Item J not judged)</b>			.

# Errett Lobban Cord

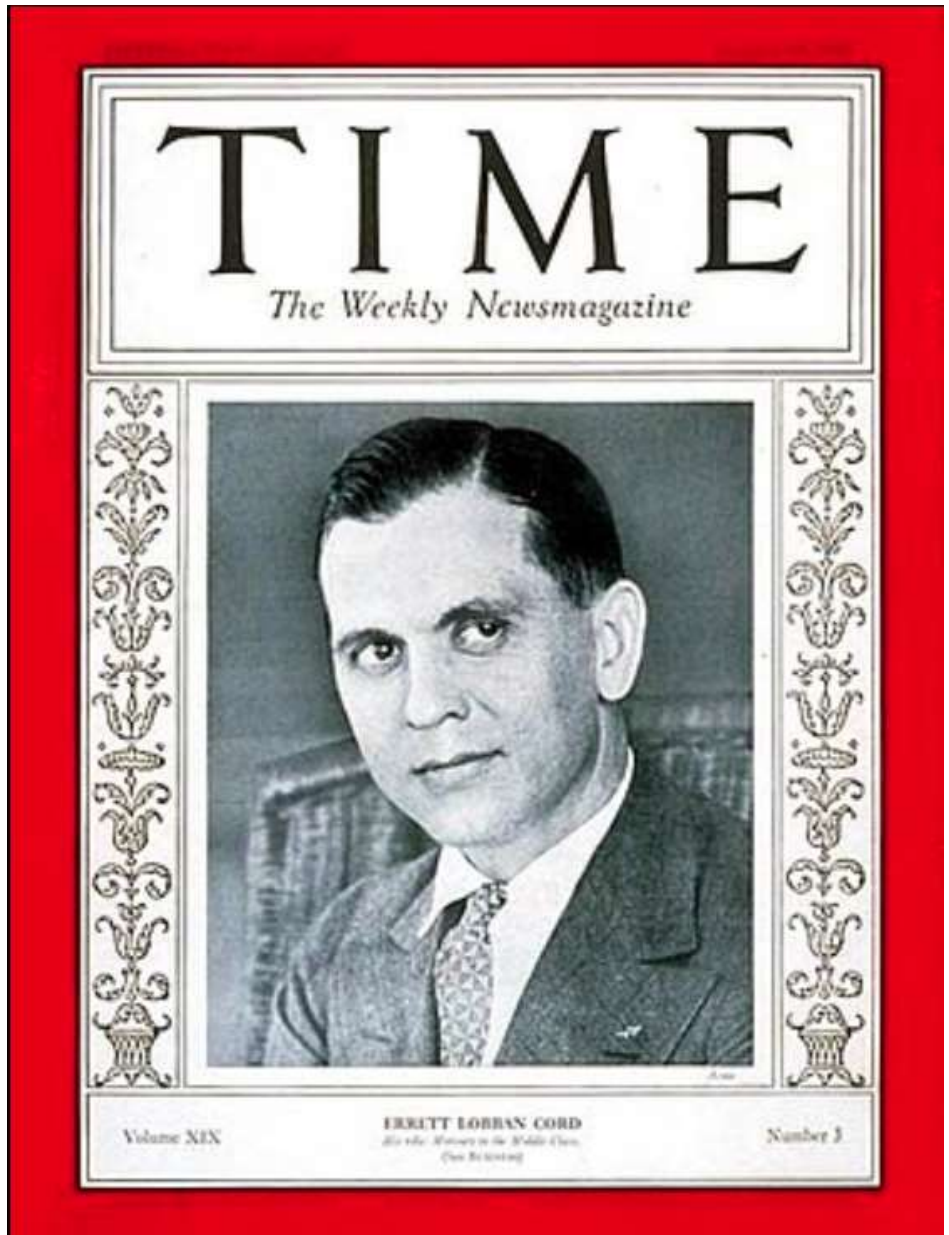
Born in **Warrensburg, Missouri**, Cord had been a race car driver, mechanic and car salesman before he was offered the opportunity to manage the dying Auburn Automobile Company in 1924. By 1928 he controlled Auburn, which by 1931 was the 13th largest seller of autos in the United States.

During 1934, he moved to England, reportedly because of kidnapping threats. He moved back to the United States in 1936, but then came under investigation by the Securities and Exchange Commission for his dealings in Checker Cab stock.

In 1937 he sold the Cord Corporation to the Aviation Corporation and retired to Los Angeles to earn even more millions in real estate.

Cord owned several of the first radio and television stations in California and later Nevada, where he moved in the 1940s. In the call letters of his Los Angeles radio station, KFAC, the A.C. stands for Auburn Cord. In Reno, Cord established KCRL-TV and radio in the 1950s and operated it for more than 25 years. The 'CRL' in the station's call letters stood for "Circle L"—a ranch Cord owned in the Nevada desert.

During the 1940s he filled in for a Nevada state legislator who died in the middle of his term and again rose to fame as a politician in his later life. In 1958 he was asked to run for governor of Nevada, but he refused and never explained why. He died in Reno, Nevada from cancer in 1974, aged 79.





Longest production vehicle ever made was the 1974-76 Cadillac Fleetwood 75, measuring at an impressive 252.8 inches.
