What to expect

COVERS & BIMINI TOPS

Covers are generally made in either Sunbrella Plus, Stamoid, Mariner, PVC or Weathermax. Each type of cover has different cleaning methods which are set out below.

We use a high quality Dabond thread which is UV treated and with general use will last a minimum of 3 years. Life beyond this is dependent on weather extremes, cleaning and abrasion.

Things you should know

ALL new covers will leak through the stitching

- It's a manufacturing fact that the needle and <u>thread piercing the material leaves a bigger</u> <u>hole than the thread</u>.
- This will normally take <u>around 4 weeks to</u> <u>settle</u>, depending on weather conditions. If there isn't much rain, this could take longer.
- We do have a seam sealer available if the area that is leaking is causing a real issue (i.e. dripping onto unprotected electronics) – we don't use this as a matter of course because it does delay the stitching sealing up by itself.

Mildew can form if material is not cleaned

 Mildew will not form in any of the mentioned fabrics, but <u>can form if the material is not</u> <u>clean</u> and there is salt & dirt on the cover so **be vigilant** and **air your cover/boat regularly** especially over the wetter months.

If water is pooling, contact us immediately

- If you notice any water pooling anywhere on your cover, that requires attention and you should call us immediately.
- <u>Pooled water can stretch the fabric</u>, making it difficult to get a tight fit. In some cases, a pole and boat vent will be required.
- Sometimes as a cover ages, this can also lead to pooling which if left unattended could reduce the life expectancy of your cover so make sure you always fit your cover correctly.

Clean & Rinse

- In all cases, if you have mildew on or under your cover, clean the cover with a mixture of <u>1/4 cup Morning Fresh, 1 cup of bleach and 4</u> <u>litres of water</u>.
- Rinse VERY thoroughly and try as much as you can <u>not to let the bleach sit on the</u> <u>stitching</u> – so please note that if you are regularly having to clean mildew off your cover, this will reduce the life expectancy of your stitching

Basic Care for Different Fabrics *

Sunbrella & Weathermax

Combine Cleaner:

- 1/4 Cup Dishwashing Liquid (Morning Fresh is our Preferred Cleaner)
- 4 Litres Water

Use soft brush or broom & work cleaner into the cover

Wash off all excess soapy water with clean water and allow to dry before refitting

Specific Cleaning Instructions for stains e.g. <u>rust, tree sap & grease</u> can be found on the Sunbrella or Weathermax websites

Important Notes - All Fabrics

Do NOT <u>remove Bimini Tops</u> for cleaning

Do NOT use abrasive cleaners e.g. Jif or Gumption

Stamoid, Mariner & PVC

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Rinse Cover with clean water



Combine **Cleaner**:

- 1/4 Cup Dishwashing Liquid (Morning Fresh is our Preferred Cleaner)
- 4 Litres Water

Use soft cloth, brush or broom

Work cleaner into the cover

For stubborn stains:

- put the Morning Fresh on the spot neat & work it in a circular motion until stain is removed.
- Sometimes you may need to let the Morning Fresh soak in for 5 minutes or so

Wash off & Rinse thoroughly

 especially if you have spot cleaned, make sure the area is rinsed well with clean water

After Cleaning, allow fabric covers to dry before re-fitting
