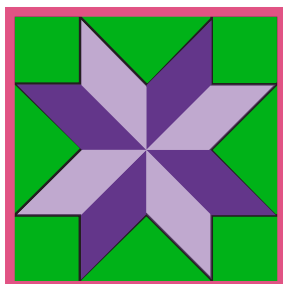

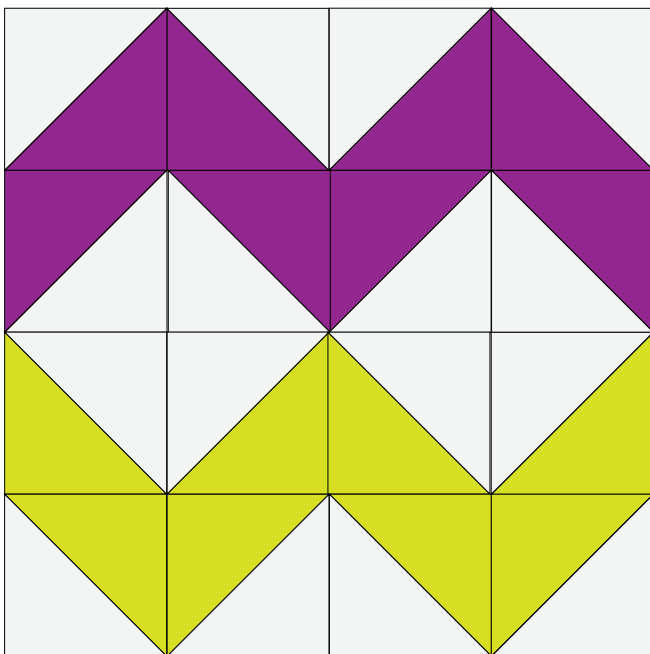

Minimum bid is \$25.

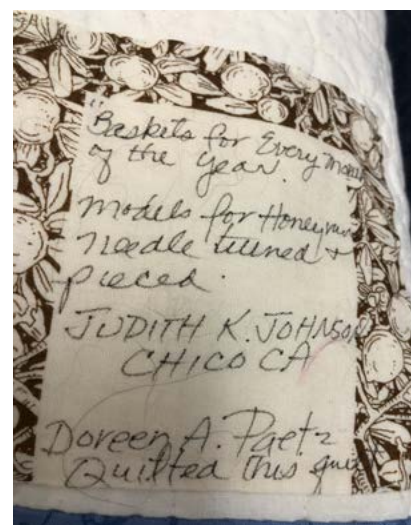
