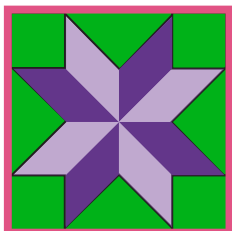

Her workshop, Fantasy Falls, will teach numerous techniques, such as making burnt-edge applique trees and puff paint trees with Lutradur leaves, using roving and Angelina fiber, heated sheer fabrics, and melted cellophane; and other methods to create the art quilt.

2025 Challenge of the “Century”

6 Joys of Quilt Challenges

1. Challenges can help improve our skillsets.

- Challenges are a great place to incorporate a technique that you’ve been wanting to try or one you want to improve.

2. Challenges help stretch or jumpstart creativity.

- Strange color palettes, weird themes, odd sizes, traditional vs. art quilts any or all of these can take us out of our comfort zones and stretch us creatively. They can also help get us out of creative ruts.

3. Challenges don’t have to be time busters.

- Challenges are typically smaller projects and this challenge in particular is crafted so you can create something wonderful with a minimum amount of time and effort.

4. Challenges are confidence builders.

- Completing a challenge that may have stretched us technically or creatively is a great way to build confidence not only in our abilities as quilters but in our perseverance and determination.

5. Challenges help build collegiality and connection

- Collegiality and connection are vital to the success of any guild. Challenges help us build both through working together for a common goal, sharing of resources, helping someone learn a technique, being an encourager and cheerleader.

6. Challenges are a platform to showcase our work and celebrate what we’ve created both individually and as a quilting family.

- We’ll gather together to ooooh and ahhhhh over all of our magnificent creations.
- Quilts are displayed anonymously, so , ...for those who are shy about sharing this is the perfect venue to take a step out of your comfort zone. Everyone will have the opportunity to share and shine, and we hope you do; however, no one will be put on the spot.

Reminder: It’s not too late to sign up or too early to start. Quilts will be turned in at the November meeting and displayed at our December meeting.

Community Service Report

Kathy Thomas, Community Service Chair

I have informed the Board that I can no longer dedicate as much time to Community Service that I have in the past. I am agreeable to remain in the Chairperson position, but my duties will be limited to:

1. Reporting to the membership at the General meetings and the Board meetings.
2. Maintaining the donation distribution records.
3. Maintaining the annual budget.
4. Assembling quilt kits and over-seeing their distribution to the membership willing to piece, quilt and bind.

The Board has agreed with me that the Community Service program needs to be restructured. ASQG is an awesome organization with extremely talented members.

We currently make not only quilts but fifteen other items for eleven different organizations. In order to best serve these organizations and others in our community we need more dedicated volunteers to do more than just “make” the items. We need members to act as the liaison with each of these organizations: What items do they need/want? How many items per month/year? How can we best meet their needs? Do they have any suggestions or questions regarding our donations?

I am grateful to those members that assemble the various kits and sew the items. However, we also need more member involvement for quality control. Are our completed items properly washed, pressed, free of loose threads, and have a label properly secured on it; are they neatly folded and/or packaged? We need member volunteers to sort items, count them, complete the distribution paperwork and arrange for timely delivery. Volunteers must also be responsible for getting the completed and signed distribution sheets turned into the Chairperson.



I have lots of ideas for restructuring our Community Service program and I also welcome any ideas from the membership. I think the phrase “Many hands make light work” applies to us. Having more people available to help in a task makes the task easier to complete and succeed at. There is also an ancient Chinese proverb that is very similar to the phrase which translates as “When everybody adds fuel, the flames rise high.” So let’s have a dialogue at our June meeting, allow our “flame” to rise high and make our Guild the best that it can be.

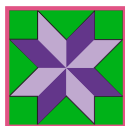

Descriptions and Responsibilities for ASQG Elected Board Members

A. PRESIDENT

- a. Is the Chief officer and official spokesperson for ASQG
- b. Presides over all general and board meetings, if possible
- c. Appoints
 - i. Committee chairpersons of standing and special committees
 - ii. Members of to the Nominating committee
- d. Instructs the Secretary regarding the issuance of notice, minutes, and general correspondence
- e. Receives financial reports from the Treasurer
- f. Is a member of the Budget Review Committee
- g. Presents the finalized budget to the Board for approval
- h. Signs all ASQG checks with the Treasurer being the co-signer.
- i. Signs all ASQG contracts
- j. Updates the ASQG Welcome Letter annually
- k. Maintains the ASQG calendar in the absence of the Parliamentarian
- l. Performs other duties that pertain to the office of the President

B. VICE – PRESIDENT(S)

- a. Performs such duties as requested by the President
- b. Conducts meetings in the absence or at the request of the President
- c. Assumes all duties and responsibilities of the President for the remainder of the term in the event the President cannot or will not complete their term in office
- d. Is the assistant to the President in all matters
- e. Plans general meeting programs including choosing speakers and contracting for their services
- f. Obtains workshop instructors and contracts for their services
- g. Performs other duties that pertain to the office of the Vice – President

C. RECORDING SECRETARY

- a. Keeps records of minutes including all motions made and carried at each general meeting or special meeting
