Isn't that all awesome? This may prove to be our best year yet.



For our next workshop, we are excited to have Michelle Trimble of Quilting Chemistry present Stunning Improv Sunbursts.

Michelle is a quilter, pattern designer, and educator based in San Francisco with 20 years of teaching experience, including teaching at regional and national conventions. She enjoys experimenting with new techniques, dramatic layouts with bold saturated colors, and adding texture to her quilts with free motion quilting. Her work has been featured in magazines and hung at local and international quilt shows including Houston International Quilt Festival and QuiltCon. In this intermediate level workshop, we will explore several different variations of improv triangles and the blocks into a large wedge layout to make a 24" square wall hanging.

September 4, 2025

The 2026 Quilt Show does not have a Chairperson(s) at this time. The Quilt Show planning will begin in January, 2026. Most of the sub-committees have chairpersons. We do need someone (or a team) to coordinate and oversee the Quilt Show.

Missie Carpenter presented our Out-going President Kelly Knox with quilt blocks created by members to thank you for her past year as President.

Block of the Month: Barbara Rosamond: Block of the Month for October is a Ghost block. Please return your Ghost blocks at the October General Meeting.

Boutique: Suzanne Steel spoke representing Seams to Sew Small Group. The Boutique and Opportunity Quilt(s) will be at the Durham Harvest Festival in Durham, September 21 from 9-4. A sign-up sheet was circulated for volunteers to work in the booth.

Community Service: Kathy Thomas/ Dorothy Van Pelt: Kathy reviewed the Flow Chart she has created showing the committee members that are in charge of each item and how each step in each project comes together. She noted that Professional quilters will be paid \$40 if they chose to the compensation to quilt the Community Service quilts.

She reminded members when you return a completed community service item you will be entered in a monthly drawing.


