Thread Painting is a technique where the artist prints a photograph onto a piece of fabric, and stitches by machine using free motion (feed dogs dropped, and a darning foot on the machine) over the image so that the image is —usually—completely covered in thread. Students will have the option of using a preprinted image provided by Sandra (\$5.00 each), or they can use their own image.
